

October 2018 Philanthropy Report

This is my final Philanthropy report. I want to tell all of you what a wonderful experience this has been. I have made so many friends and have so enjoyed working on this important project. This is the most generous group of people! You have touched so many lives with warmth and comfort and I know you will continue to do so. Even though I will not be on the official Philanthropy team, I will continue to work in the background, just because it is such fun and I think it is so important. Bless all of you for making my job so easy and such a pleasure.

In the September newsletter, the passing of Mary Emery was noted. Along with her Philanthropy work, she quilted with the TLC group and with a church group. The church group donated 27 baby blankets in memory of Mary. We received about half of them. The balance went to TLC, which is another philanthropic quilting group. We are so grateful and will happily pass them on to Operation Showers of Appreciation (the Camp Pendleton baby shower group). I am so blessed to have been friends with Mary. She touched many lives and will continue to be missed. Between the August and September Guild meetings, Philanthropy donated 89 quilts, 85 other baby items, and 21 pillowcases. Operation Showers of Appreciation received 44 baby quilts, 27 handmade stuffed chicks, 38 taggie lovies and 20 baby girl onesies. Orange County Child Abuse Prevention received 20 children's quilts and 6 pillowcases. Prototypes received 2 quilts. Royale Therapeutic Treatment Center received 1 quilt and 15 pillowcases. Orange County Rescue Mission received 6 quilts. United Cerebral Palsy received 2 quilts. UCI Oncology received 6 quilts. Seven quilts were sent to victims of the Carr fire and one quilt went to an individual in need.

Annual totals will be in the next newsletter. Numbers will be tallied at the end of September – the end of our fiscal year.

Sandy Corbin told us about a sewing club started by some teachers in Newberry Springs, just outside of Barstow. This school has little for resources, except for 20 new sewing machines that were donated. We gave Sandy a bunch of fabric for their use. If you want to contribute to this program, which will teach kids and moms to sew, you can contact Philanthropy or Sandy.

The next Philanthropy Sewing Day will be Monday, October 1st, at the Laguna Niguel Library, 30341 Crown Valley Parkway, Laguna Niguel, from 10:30 until about 4:00. Show and Tell will be at 11:00. Liz Pickering and Jana McDonough will be leading the event, as they have for the past several months. Philanthropy is a great way to make friends, as well as contributing to such an important cause. You can spend as much of the day as you wish.







X'S AND O'S

Fabric Requirements:

Blocks:

Prints: 2 Charm Packs[™] (80-5" squares) Solid: 1 Charm Pack[™] (40-5" squares)

Solid Inner Border: ½ yard Final Border & Binding: ¾ yard

Backing: 3 yards

X'S AND O'S

Quilt is 45" x 45".

Fabric requirements for Roadies Give Back:

The 2½" Squares (Solid - Under the Directions) must be in solid, or printed fabric black - but the print should be mostly black.

The 5" Square (Print - Under the Directions) must be in brights - any color is appropriate.




Instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance.


Blocks

Solid Charm Pack™: Cut each square in half twice to make 4 matching 2½" squares. Press the 2½" squares in half on the diagonal (or draw a line on the diagonal). Press 160 squares.


2 Block: Layer a two 2½" Solid squares on the lower left and upper right corner of the one 5" Charm square, right sides together. Sew on the diagonal lines.




 Trim ¼" from the seam lines. Press to the corners to form triangles. Repeat to make a total of 100 Blocks that are 5" square



3 Large Block: Take 4 Blocks and lay them solid to solid and print to print.



4 Assembly: Sew the Large Blocks into 5 rows that each have 5 Large Blocks. Press the rows in alternating rows. Combine the rows.

We need various stages of progress, for Saturday evening. We need tops that are pinned and ready to quilt, tops that are quilted and needing binding. We need finished blocks. Pretty much anything you can do will help!

We encourage you to go through your stash. If you cannot participate in making a block, you can donate fabric from your stash for our crew to use in the quilts.
