In March, we welcome Sherri McConnell, teacher, lecturer, Moda Fabric designer and avid blogger.

Inspired by a rich family heritage of women who love sewing and creating, Sherri loves to sew and quilt. She has the most magical memories of home made gifts from her mom, aunt, grandmother, and great-grandmother and began to sew on her own with a sewing machine at age ten. In the early 1990's encouraged and taught by her grandmother, she began her quilt making journey.

Sherri created her blog "A Quilting Life" in 2008 in order to keep track of her quilting and sewing projects. It quickly became so much more, and opened up a whole new world of quilting inspiration! Creating and sharing with the online quilting community led to many opportunities including publishing quilt patterns and books: a Quilting Life: Creating a Handmade Home 2013; Fresh Family Traditions 2014, Sunday Best Quilts 2019, coauthored with Corey Yoder. In 2015, Sherri and her daughter Chelsi began designing fabric for Moda Fabrics.

Keri' President's Quilt: Gardening, Flowers and Wine

Every year Beach Cities makes a quilt for the outgoing president as a thank you for all her hard work. Each member is asked to make one 5" finished block and return it by the May meeting. Keri has chosen a cute wine and garden theme, with a selection of light blue background fabrics. I will be at the March meeting with 7" squares to hand out, please stop by and pick one up! Keri would love to have everyone participate as a remembrance of her year. If you picked up a square in February, I will be happy to accept your finished block! You can always mail me your finished block as well.

Here are the rules:

- 1. Your design must fit within the middle of a 5" square. The committee will square up the blocks after they are turned in so please do NOT trim your block down.
- 2. All methods of appliqué, piecing, paper piecing, embroidery, etc. are welcome. If you do raw edge appliqué, please zigzag the edges.
- 3. Embellishments are fine, just do not attach them to the block. Put them into a small baggie with your name on it and staple to the edge of your block. The Committee will attach after quilting.
- 4. **Your name is important**. Please write your name close to the edge of your design so it doesn't get cut off when the blocks are squared up. I will have some pens available for you to use if you forget to sign your name.


New Member Gathering—March 2023

You can finish at home and have a 44.5" by 62" adorable quilt. The pattern is available on Etsy. Participants will receive a code for a 25% discount. Fabric requirements are available under the description for the PDF pattern on Sherri's Etsy site i Home Sweet Home. It's easy to picture this quilt in sweet fabric or Kaffe or maybe even in darker colors inspired by "Wednesday" on Net-



Friday April 14, 2023 Robin Pickens Workshop to Perfect Curves and Play with Color

Robin Pickens is giving participants a choice of patterns, either Mod Flower Box or the Beanstalk pattern. Either pattern will give us the opportunity to have perfect curves and fun with color. The Mod Flower Box wall quilt is Charm Pack or Fat Eighth friendly. Mod Flower Box quilt pattern from Robin Pickens - Robin Pickens The Beanstalk pattern gives you the opportunity to play with your greens (fabric, that is). Beanstalk Quilt Pattern by Robin Pickens with Painted Meadow - Robin Pickens With either pattern you can create the circle template or use the Creative Grids Circle Savvy Ruler. Participants need to have a pattern for class.

Friday May 12, 2023 Dora Cary of Orange Dot Quilters

Dora will help us make the "H' bag- an easy to make bag, perfect for shopping, or the farmer's market or holding unfinished projects. The "H" bag comes in two sizes and the leftover fabric can be turned into a small zippered pouch. Perfect time to use your machine's zipper foot in class and see how easy it is to install a zipper. The mini H bag is another option. It does require interfacing to give it more oomph. If making the Mini H bag you might need spare fabric to make the zippered pouch.

The 2022-23 workshops are proving to be very popular. Beginning with the Dora Cary of Orange Dot Quilters workshop registration, only BCQG members can sign up during the first month that registration is available. <u>Fabric</u>	Size
Background Fabric A	Cut 8 - 1.5" squares
Heart Fabric B/C (Top Left)	Cut 2 - 3.5" x 6.5" rectangles
Heart Fabric B/C (Bottom Right)	Cut 2 – 3.5" x 6.5" rectangles
Background Fabric E	Cut 4 – 3.5" squares
9-Patch Fabric 1 - C	Cut 5 – 2.5" x 5.0" strips
9-Patch Fabric 2 - C	Cut 3 – 2.5" x 5.0" strips

 Sew two 5.0" x 2.5" 9-Patch Fabric 1 strips together with one 9-Patch Fabric 2 strip placing the Fabric 2 in the middle. Repeat 1 time.




Cut each of the rectangles into two 2.5" strips.




 Sew two 5.0" x 2.5" 9-Patch Fabric 2 strips together with one 9-Patch Fabric 1 strip placing the Fabric 1 in the middle.



Cut the rectangle into two 2.5" strips.



3. Combine strips as shown to produce two 6.5" x 6.5" 9-patch units.



4. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each small (Fabric A - 1.5") background square. Place the squares on the top of two B rectangles and two C rectangles putting right sides together. Sew on the line; trim the corners leaving 1/4" and press seams open. (See diagram above to see

direction of each of the four 6.5" rectangles." to match diagram to make the heart shape.



- Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each background E fabric (3.5" square).
- 6. With right sides facing, layer a fabric E square on the bottom left corner of Heart Fabric B (top left heart). Sew on the line, trim the corners leaving ¼", and press seams open. (See diagram above to see direction of each of the four 3.5" squares.) Repeat this for the bottom right heart.





7. With right sides facing, layer a fabric E square on the bottom left corner of Heart Fabric C (top left heart). Sew on the line, trim the corners leaving ¼", and press seams open. (See diagram above to see direction of each of the four 3.5" squares.) Repeat this for the bottom right heart.





Sew the halves of the hearts together for both the top left and bottom right hearts.

- 9. Sew top left heart to the 9-patch unit created in step 3.
- 10. Sew bottom right heart to the 9-patch unit created in step 3.
- 11.Sew the two units from steps 8 and 9 together with the left heart on the top. Press seam open.
