Donna's President's Quilt: "National Parks"

Donna's fabulous theme is "National Parks" as she has hiked many of these beautiful parks!

You still have time to make a block for the President's Quilt!

The Quilt Blocks are due back at the May 2025 meeting.

How to Make a President's Quilt Block

1. **Pick up a free 7 " background square of fabric (this is the unfinished block size) at the President's Quilt table at the April Guild meeting.** Fabrics have been preselected from specific colors for the background. (If you attend via Zoom or missed the meeting then please email me and I will send you a block by mail.)

2. **Your design must fit within the middle of a 5" square.**

I suggest drawing a 5 inch square in the middle of the 7 inch square. Any design outside of that 5 inch line will not be in the final block. Important: do

not trim or square your block down. This will be done by the committee after all the blocks have been collected.

3. All methods of appliqué, paper piecing, embroidery etc... are welcome. If you use raw edge appliqué, please zig-zag the edges down.

4. Embellishments are welcome, just do not attach them to the block. Please put them in a small baggie with your name on it and staple it to the edge of your block.

5. **Sign your block close to the edge of your design,** so Donna will know who created the block. I will have Pens at the table for anyone needing them. Your signature means so much to the President, and I have enjoyed looking at each one of the blocks on my President's quilt and knowing who created it!

6. Turn in your block to the President's Quilt Table at the April or May Guild meetings.

Finally, I am looking for members who would be willing to host the Quilting Bees in their homes .

This quilt is going to be Fabulous because BCQG members are so creative and talented!

A Note from the Programs Chair

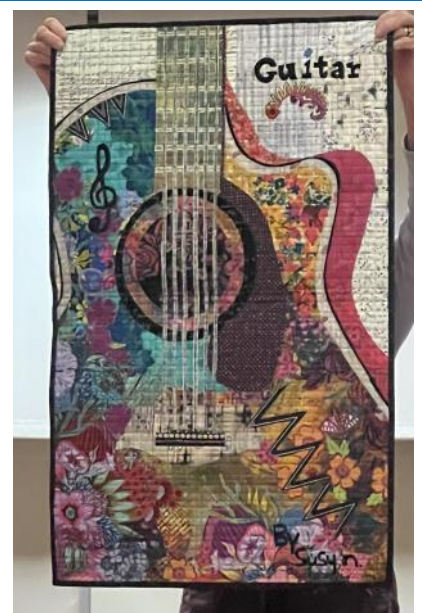
Calling all Beach Cities Quilters:

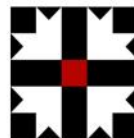

We will have the usual things at sew day; irons, ironing board, cutting mats, etc. Not bringing your sewing machine, we will have projects you can work on, either cutting or hand sewing. There's always something to keep you busy.

At our May meeting, Debi Martin will be showing you how to put together the Zebra pattern easily. The pattern is on our Philanthropy page on the BCQG website. Debi will have patterns at the meeting and we posted one on our page of the website.

I want to thank all of you who are using your stash fabric to create beautiful Philanthropy quilts. We can help you with backing and batting. If you're making a baby size quilt, we'd love for you to try your hand at quilting it on your domestic machine, but you can always turn it in, ready for long-arming.

To ready your quilt for longarming:

- *the quilt top should be finished with a scant 1/4" seam around the perimeter.
- *Your backing should be at least 4 inches larger than your top on all sides - please press your seams, square off the edges.
- *Your batting should be at least 4 inches larger than your top on all sides
- * binding pieced and ironed
- *include a label

We are creating a form you need to fill out with the sizes, your name and phone number so if the quilter runs into a question or problem you will be contacted.

We are working on putting quilt sizes on our page of the website, along with quilt patterns we use.

Philanthropy News

We have collected 35 quilts for camp and the pillowcases to go with them. If you are turning in quilts we will keep them for next year. We are in need of men's pillowcases. I don't have much in storage that is very manly, it's mostly kids and flowers. Baby quilts are always needed as we deliver them quarterly.




