I know everyone's been busy getting ready for quilt show so maybe that's why we didn't have much this past month.

If you sign up for a workshop in advance and for some reason you can't make it, please contact Janet Crothers and let her know. She's noticed that a few members have been no-shows lately. If it's a workshop with a waiting list, that means someone who might have wanted to come wouldn't be able.

How to Make a President's Quilt Block

1. Pick up a free 7" background square of fabric (**this is the unfinished block size**) at the President's Quilt table at the Guild Meeting. Fabrics have been preselected from specific colors for the background.
2. Your design **must** fit within the middle of a 5" square. I suggest drawing a 5" square in the middle of the 7" square. Any design outside of that 5" line will not be in the final block. **Important: Do Not trim or square up your block!** This will be done by the committee after all the blocks have been collected.
3. All methods of applique, paper piecing, embroidery etc...are welcome. If you use raw edge applique, please zig-zag the edges down.
4. Embellishments are welcome, just do not attach them to the block. Please put them in a small baggie with your name on it and staple it to the edge of your block.
5. **Sign your block close to the edge of your design**, so that Laura will know who created the block. I will have Pens at the table for anyone needing them. Your signature means so much to the President.
6. **Turn in your block to the President's Quilt Table at the April or May Guild meetings.**

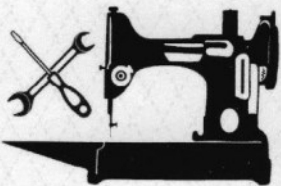

JUNE WORKSHOP

Karen Bolan's Piece Curves and Play with Transparency

Date: June 12, 2026

Time: 10:00 am - 4:00 pm (doors open at 9:30 am)

Location: Murray Center, Juniper Room

Are you intimidated by curves but love precision piecing? Make the Cool as a Cactus quilt in class, featuring pieced curves, a unique border treatment, and color palette that features transparency. Class will begin with an exercise in creating transparency effects, then we work from paper templates to accurately cut and piece large diameter curves. Students must purchase the digital pattern. Leave class with at least one block and border complete.



Students will learn to cut and precisely piece large-diameter curves from templates, assemble a quilt top with pieced borders, and plan a color palette that includes a transparency effect. This is a six-hour class with instructive lecture, demonstration, discussion, and ample time for practice and personal attention.



☀ Meet the Maker: Hanne “Mama” Lohde

Hanne (Mama) Lohde’s love for stitching began at the age of five, sitting on the floor of her mother’s sewing room. While her mom worked on a summer dress, little Hanne stitched a tiny dress for her doll—and she’s been stitching ever since.

As a teen, she created much of her own clothing and even sold her knitwear during college. Over the years, stitching, storytelling, and designing by hand have become not just creative outlets, but lifelong sources of joy and relaxation.

In 2020, during the quiet of the pandemic, Hanne brought her long-held dream to life: she designed her very first wool story quilt and founded **Mama Lohde**—a creative studio built on sharing the magic of slow stitching, wool applique, and thread-based storytelling.

Since then, she has been teaching her special embroidery techniques to other stitches in her weekly Open Stitch with Mama Lohde classes as well as teaching at retreats nationally and overseas. She has won many awards and recognitions of her unique work.

In 2023, Hanne also became a published author with her children’s book, *Bubbles*—a whimsical tale rooted in her love for storytelling and endangered sea life.

She lives in Southern California with her family and beloved dogs and continues to design, teach, and inspire others to create from the heart—one stitch at a time.


