

Programs

This month's speaker is Anna Marie Horner!

Anna Maria Horner is an artist, author and fabric designer, known for her colorful fabric designs, quilts, and sewing patterns. In addition to teaching classes and selling items globally under her namesake brand, she has written several books about sewing, quilting, and needlework. She has appeared on The Martha Stewart Show and been featured in Better Homes and Gardens.

She grew up in a house full of her dad's paintings and with a closet full of her mom's handiwork. Beds were warmed by the hand-loomed wool blankets sent by her grandmother from

Greece. The busy little bodies of her and her siblings were warmed by the beautiful hand-knits of their grandmother in Indiana. As a kid in the 70's, she passed store-bought Barbie dresses and instead created her own from her mother's fabric scraps. A simple start to a diverse path.

In 1995, after graduating with an Honors Fine Arts Degree in Drawing from the University of Tennessee, Anna Maria opened Handmaiden, a clothing and housewares boutique. This retail space served as the home base for Anna Maria's clothing line which she designed and produced, together with her mom. Eventually, the label was offered to the wholesale market, where it sold at several stores across the country. In the midst of clothing design and production, she stayed active artistically by exhibiting in galleries regularly and her paintings, both small and large scale, are a part of hundreds of private and commercial collections.

There have been varied stops on her path to here, but a common element in all of her work, whether fashion, quilting or fine art, is a passion for the language of color. Somewhere around 2001, her fascination with taking an idea through all the necessary steps from her sketchbook to a store shelf sparked the momentum to create a brand. Anna Maria's fresh perspectives within traditional markets and her vision of being surrounded by the work of her own hands has led her to partnering with more than two dozen manufacturers to design homewares, gift items, and textiles.

Anna Maria is the mother of seven (8 to 30) and all of her creative endeavors have been sparked in the presence of her family. As one bird after another flies out of the nest, she and the younger sort recently moved from their long-time home (and home studio) in Nashville down the road to charming Historic Franklin. 

Bee Thankful Tea Challenge

We are so excited to kick off our Fall Tea Challenge "Bee Thankful"!

These wonderful wall-hangings will adorn the room during the tea luncheon. It's so fun to see how each member interprets the challenge theme and uses their fabric. The rules are simple:

- Members must buy a kit to participate. Kits will be for sale starting at the March guild meeting. Kits will also be available at meetings thereafter until sold out. \$15, cash or check only.
- Your entry must be inspired by our theme, Bee Thankful.
- You must use each of the three fabrics, a little or a lot, front or back, dyed or whatever! We just must be able to recognize it.
- You must include the two included charms, (the bee and the flower), a piece of the twine, and one hexagon shape. The shape can be appliquéd, pieced, quilted, drawn, embroidered, etc. The white fabric with the hexagon shape already on it does not count!
- Perimeter of the quilt should be no less then 48", not greater then 160".
- Patterns are WELCOME!
- Complete rules and entry form are included in your kit.
- Challenges will be DUE AT THE SEPTEMBER 14, 2023 GUILD MEETING.
- Awards, including Viewers Choice on the day of the event, will be given.

Back-to-normal changes to guild meetings:


Members bring a snack for the hospitality table (home-baked or purchased) on their birthday month.

Block Party—Hearts




Hearts - June



Cutting Instructions:

Background Fabric A	Cut 4 - 2.5" squares
Background Fabric D	Cut 2 - 6.5" squares
Miscellaneous Heart	Cut 24 - 6.5" x 1.5" strips
Fabric	-OR- Cut 12 13" x 1.5"
	strips

 Sew 6 6.5" x 1.5" strips together to create a 6.5" square. Repeat 3 times to create a total of 4 6.5" squares.



Refer to the diagrams above to see direction of each of the four 6.5" squares.

Block Party— Hearts

- Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each background small square. Place the squares on the top left and right of the two top heart units putting right sides together. Sew on the lines, trim the corners leaving ¼" and press seams open.
- Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each background large square.
- Place one square on the bottom left side of the heart bottom left and one square on the right side of the heart bottom right.



- Sew Left B (top) to Left B bottom using a 1/4" seam. Sew Right B (top to Right B bottom using ¼" seam. Press seams open.
- Sew the two halves of the heart block right sides together. Press seam open.
- 8. Sew left heart unit to right heart unit.


