The result was a new technique using rulers, books, and patterns so that her Mariner's Compass is strip pieced – no paper piecing is involved! She started "Robin Ruth Design" and now has a website with all of her products, patterns in 16 sizes and more. Robin will be teaching on Friday her Strip-Pieced Mariner's Compass Basics Technique Class. Please visit her site at www.robinruthdesign.com.



A Washington State native, Robin grew up on a cattle ranch in Eastern Washington and, after a 7-year Navy stint with husband David, has lived in the Seattle area for over 25 years and together they have one daughter. Robin learned how to sew from her mother at a very young age and was later introduced to quilting by her grandmother in the mid 80's. Her degree is in Communications/Public Relations, and she successfully ran and owned a gift store, Sun Prairie Trading Co., for 16 years with her mother. After closing the store and sending her daughter off to college, Robin refocused her attention on the ruler idea that had been in the back of her mind for over 20 years.

When she isn't on the road teaching and giving workshops, she is working on many new projects that bring the mariner's compass into the 21st century! Her products are sold in quilt shops across the U.S and around the world.

Our workshops are held at Community Presbyterian Church, 32202 Del Obispo Street, San Juan Capistrano, CA 92675. Time: 10:00 AM – 4:00 PM.

Please arrive at least 15 minutes early to set up your work space. After the workshop chair helps the speaker and sets up the classroom, she will be happy to help you if you need assistance. Remember to bring your lunch/drink/snack. You won't want to spend time buying a lunch since the lunch break is limited. Fees are usually \$50, but can be more when the speaker is bringing supplies. All fees are noted in the newsletter. **Do not bring irons even if it is on the speaker's supply list.** The Guild will provide all irons. You may cancel and receive a refund if you let the workshop chair know by email 45 days before the workshop. After that time, you can only be refunded if there is a waiting list. We will wait until a check is received from your replacement before a refund request is made. As soon as a workshop's details are announced on our website or in our newsletter (usually 3 months before the workshop), you can sign up either on the website or by emailing Kathy Hutchins. Block of the Month

September

Putting it Together





It's finally here! We get to put our blocks together and the mystery will be revealed. Before beginning, make sure that all of your blocks are properly labeled and oriented as they are shown in the block instructions.

We will begin by sewing the blocks into rows as shown below. Even though not all of the rows will have matched seams, many do, so press the seam between the 2 blocks in rows 1, 3 & 5 in one direction and 2, 4 & 6 in the opposite direction. After the rows are done, just sew them together in order and you are ready to add your borders, which are optional.

Border 1 is made with your "B" fabric using 2 ½" strips and is 2" wide, finished.

Border 2 is made with your "C" fabric or whatever you chose for the outer border and uses 5 ½" strips, and is 5" finished (I prefer narrower outer borders, so mine will be 1 ½' and 3" finished, respectively). Using the original borders, your quilt should finish at about 54" x 74".

Remember to bring your finished tops to the October meeting to be entered in the drawing!
