Philanthropy News

It sounds like the August sew day went well. I was sad to miss it.

We donated quilts this past month to: CHOC - Mission Viejo, Laguna Beach Boys and Girls Club, Royal Therapeutic Treatment Center, Silverado Memory Care, Priority Center, United Cerebral Palsy, VA Long Beach, Vets in Hospice, Village of Hope. Pillowcases went to Hospice-Vitas Community Collection. Fleece wraps to CAST and dog blankets to McDonough Rescue.

The following is the report I got from Julie Greenspan who graciously took over for me.

"Hey there! I hope your day at VBS went wonderfully! We all certainly missed your presence in the room.

I will say that everything went very smoothly today .. that philanthropy meeting runs like a well oiled machine! I'm guessing we had 40 today..at least!

Here's just a few updates:

-We got a bunch more holiday pillowcases, and a couple of holiday quilts for CHOC so that was great.

-CHOC has also let us know that they would love to have birthday pillowcases. Rachel Maus said she'd be willing to buy birthday fabric to make kits with. I told her that's great but also I would mention it to you. Maybe it's something we can do with the budget.

-The flannel holiday backing went to Debi Martin who's working on some that'll be perfect for and the cotton holiday fabric got cut into pillowcase increments however they need some other fabric to blend with them to make it work so that went back to storage in the tub that has that says "pillowcases". Next month we can try to assemble some pillowcase kits out of them.

-Norah was there and loved having the tables to use to cut her fleece and plans to do that the next time she needs to make more. I asked her if she had enough fleece. She said yes she was probably good till January at which time maybe we can make a plea to members as people seem to love to donate fleece for CAST.

-Joella and Marilyn got their bags. Ralph came and had two quilts and took two kits.

-Debi Martin is requesting a role of batting as she is now all out.

-Rachel Maus would like three rolls of batting and so she is happy to pay for them.

-Sharon Farley showed us how she is using leftover blocks or strips or pieces to make little shelter quilts that are requested by a group online. When there is a need in a city, for instance after a flood, this group puts out a call to people and they get mailed in. She made a bunch and I think she will discuss it more with you in the future as to whether it could be a project philanthropy could support not necessarily financially, but just make it another one of our projects.

-Tons of quilts turned in. Haven't counted yet but will. The entire back of my car was FULL!"

We are still looking for Christmas pillowcase and quilts (non religious themes). And baby blankets are needed. Thank you to all of you who put so much time and effort into Philanthropy, we couldn't do it without you!


