City Engineer Karla Greaser reported on the Sundance Kid Tank Project. The water line construction is wrapping up. There will be a brief shut down for winter and then the tank portion of the project will resume in the spring. MS Greaser explained change order # 2 to the council. This was a deduct in costs due to changes in the boring length and fittings. The completion date will be extended to May 15, 2022.

COUNCIL MEMBER HILTY MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER STEVENSON SECONDED a motion to approve Change Order No.2 for Hot Iron Inc. for - \$16,404.84. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

City Clerk Treasurer Kathy Lenz reported that herself and Public Works Director Mac Erickson have gone over the final punch list for Sundance Square Park with the contractor.

COUNCIL MEMBER HILTY MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT SECONDED a motion to approve ORDINANCE NO 9, 2021; AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND REENACTING SECTION 802 OF ORDINANCE NO 2, 2013 PERTAINING TO FENCE HEIGHTS AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE-THIRD AND FINAL READING. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

Discussion was held regarding the changes presented by Range Telephone Coop Inc to the Franchise Agreement.

COUNCIL MEMBER STEVENSON MOVED to table ORDINANCE 5, 2021-FRANCHISE AGREEMENT with RANGE TELEPHONE-THIRD AND FINAL READING for 60 days to do more negotiation. MOTION DIED for lack of a SECOND.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a motion to approve ORDINANCE NO 5, 2021-FRANCHISE AGREEMENT WITH RANGE TELEPHONE COOP- with the changes as presented-THIRD AND FINAL READING. COUNCIL MEMBERS MARCHANT, WILSON AND HILTY voted Aye, COUNCIL MEMBER STEVENSON voted Nay. MOTION CARRIED.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON AND HILTY thanked Jason from Range Telephone for his efforts.

COUNCIL MEMBER HILTY MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a motion to approve ORDINANCE 10, 2021- AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4 (FRANCHISE FEE) OF ORDINANCE 8, 2021; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH; SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE-SECOND READING. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

Clerk Treasurer Kathy Lenz reported the deer harvest will begin this week.

MS Lenz will be sending reminders to the Mayor and Council to attend the Downtown Revitalization meeting Thursday November 18th 11:00 a.m.-12:00 in Council Chambers.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT SECONDED a motion to allow Mayor Brooks to sign a letter of support for Wyoming Smart Capital Network (WSCN). All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Brooks asked the Council to review the proposed utility rate increase for the year 2022. No action was taken.

MS Lenz stated the MOU with Sundance Chain Gang is not ready for this meeting.

COUNCIL MEMBER STEVENSON MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a motion to approve the October 25, 2021 Land Use Committee Meeting minutes as presented.

COUNCIL MEMBER STEVENSON AMENDED HIS ORIGINAL MOTION, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED THE AMENDMENT to approve the October 25, 2021 Land Use Committee Meeting minutes pulling item E and changing the description to include decks. MAYOR BROOKS called for a vote to the Amended Motion. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED. MAYOR BROOKS called for a vote on the original motion. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

A public hearing was opened at 7:15 p.m. regarding proposed zoning changes in Sundance View Estates.

Mr. Timothy Boumeester, 1001 S 11th St came to the podium. Attorney Jeffrey Voldt representing Mr. and Mrs. Timothy Boumeester spoke with the Mayor and Council by phone. Mrs. Boumeester was also present by phone. Mr. Voldt asked permission for Mr. Boumeester to give the Mayor and Council handouts.

Mr. Voldt stated the Boumeester's opposition to the zoning change. He then explained the information in the handouts presented. Mr. Voldt stated his recommendation is to leave the zoning as commercial use.

Trey Hendrickson, 302 E Thompson St, stated his support of changing from commercial to residential zoning.

Norm Olson, 1115 Liberty Lane, stated his support of changing from commercial to residential zoning.

Susan Olson, 704 Frontage Rd, stated her opposition to the zoning change.

Mark Koep, 72 N 21st St, stated his support of changing from commercial to residential zoning.

Mark E Hughes, 512 E Park St, stated his opposition to the zoning change.

Mayor Brooks gave comments regarding how State funds such as the Direct Distribution are affected by population. He stated the areas of town which are set up for and available for commercial use and the shortage of residential property.

City Attorney Mark Hughes stated he would need to study the covenants and handouts presented by Mr. Boumeester for Sundance View Estates before he can give an opinion. Mr. Hughes recommended tabling the issue for a month.

COUNCIL MEMBER HILTY stated her concerns on the shortage of residential property and the negative impact it has on our community.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a motion to table the zoning changes in Sundance View Estates until the December council meeting. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

Public Hearing closed at 7:40 p.m.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT MOVED COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a motion to allow the Mayor to sign a letter of support for Investment in Rail Transportation Infrastructure in the Greater Northwest Region. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

Department Head Reports:

Sheriff Jeff Hodge reported 112 calls for the month.

Fire Chief Gari Gill reported he is seeking money for an addition to the Fire Hall. He says the department has out grown the space available. He is getting an estimate to improve the lighting of the fire hall.

Mr. Gill says his department has raised \$67,000 in recent years and over ½ of that money has gone back into equipment and gear for the fire fighters. The current cost is running about \$3600.00 per fire person.
