

April 4, 2017

The Town Council met this day in regular session at 7:00 p.m. with Mayor Paul Brooks presiding.

Mayor Brooks presented a Proclamation on April 4, 2017 as the Mayor's Recognition Day for National Service.

Roll call was taken by Mayor Brooks with Council Members Sheryl Klocker, Brad Marchant, Joe Wilson and Jana McLean present.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER KLOCKER SECONDED a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. All ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

Approve Minutes of the City Council Regular Meeting of March 7, 2017 as published. Approve Treasurer's Report with a general account balance of \$981,218.15; a utility deposit fund account balance of \$43,416.92 and a \$341.92 transfer into the general account from the utility deposit fund account for the amount applied to utility bills and interest. Approve the March adjustment report. Approve the March Paid Invoice report. Approve the April Unpaid Invoice Report. Approve the Monthly Municipal Court Report. MOTION (per consent agenda)

Mayor Brooks announced the upcoming meetings: NEWY meeting in Gillette at 8:00 am on Saturday, April 22, 2017; Crook County Solid Waste Joint Powers Board meeting in Hulett on April 19, 2017 at 6:30 pm.

City Engineer Karla Greaser reported on the Cole transmission waterline and PRV projects. Tryhydro is still waiting on WDEQ permit application review. They have been in contact with WDEQ to see if there is anything they can do to expedite the process. The City needs to provide a letter of opinion to Wyoming Water Development Commission that the easements have been acquired. Mayor Brooks asked City Attorney Mark Hughes to write a letter that the legal right of way is intact.

Crook County School District has given the City an easement required to finish the walking path from Washington Park through the school and out to Highway 14.

COUNCIL MEMBER KLOCKER MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a motion to allow Mayor Brooks sign the Landfill Closure-Administrative Order on Consent. All ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

Council member Klocker reported the Crook County Solid Waste Joint Powers Board did not meet in March.

No action was taken this month on the North Pole Locker Agreement.

Ken Denzin came before the Mayor and Council to discuss the plans for a walking path from Schelldorf Addition along the creek connecting to Highway 14 by the bridge. Mr. Denzin had questions on the exact location and what negotiations had taken place with the land owners. He asked the Council to think about this before they move forward on this project.

COUNCIL MEMBER MCLEAN MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER KLOCKER SECONDED a motion to allow Mayor Brooks to sign the MOU-BETWEEN CROOK COUNTY AND CITY OF SUNDANCE for waterline easements.. All ayes, MOTION CARRIED.
