Upcoming Meeting-NEWY meeting in Gillette-postponed until further notice.

City Engineer Karla Greaser reported on the Sundance West Tank Project. The contract has been signed and notice to proceed was signed on September 4th, 2020. Trihydro is waiting for a schedule from the contractor.

MS Greaser reported on the Sundance Kid Tank Project. Trihydro has completed the 50% design and a plan review meeting is scheduled for September 16, 2020.

Clerk Treasurer Kathy Lenz reported on the Old Stoney Project. September 3rd will be the final walk through. The water suppression valve is installed and passed testing from the Wyoming Fire Marshall. The Fire Alarm, Elevator and H-Vac system are ready for final inspection. Occupancy will be permitted when complete.

The Museum District has had inquires for renting available office space and it should be ready for the Museum to start moving in.

Public Works director Mac Erickson reported that the construction is moving forward for the New Sundance Square Park. The footprint for the public restrooms has been reviewed. Discussion was held on the Additional Services Agreement No. 1 presented from Norris Design last month and Change Order No. 1 from Ainsworth Benning. Change Order No. 2 is not ready at this time.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a motion to approve Change Order No. 1 from Ainsworth Benning in the amount of \$26,882.01 for the Sundance Square Park Project. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER HILTY SECONDED a motion to approve Additional Services Agreement No. 1 from Norris Design in the amount of \$4800.00. All Ayes MOTION CARRIED.

Discussion was held on sewer line location and plans for development of property on the East side of town.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER MCLEAN SECONDED a motion to allow the Mayor to sign the 2020 Addendum to the joint agreement with Crook County for the GIS Software License. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

COUNCIL MEMBER HILTY MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a motion to allow the Mayor to sign a pre-annexation agreement and a non-potable water agreement with Dr. Heath Waddell, upon City Attorney Mark Hughes completing the required documents. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

At 7:15p.m. Mayor Brooks called a public hearing for the Sundance Kid Statue relocation. No comments were heard and the hearing closed at 7:20p.m. Crook County Maintenance Larry Schommer and County Attorney Joe Baron were present.

Discussion was held regarding door to door peddlers and the procedure for obtaining peddler permits. City Attorney Mark Hughes commented that the City has the right to prohibit the issue of such permits.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER HILTY SECONDED a motion to stop issuing Door to Door peddling permits in the town of Sundance WY. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

Discussion was held regarding an inquiry from the Pee Wee Football Board. They asked if the City would consider letting the program run under the City's recreation program.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a motion to allow Mayor Brooks to appoint the Pee Wee Football Board to join with the City Recreation program and develop a plan moving forward. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

COUNCIL MEMBER MARCHANT MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON SECONDED a FRIENDLY AMENDMENT to the motion to allow the appointment upon City Attorney Hughes approval of a waiver for Pee Wee Football registration. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

COUNCIL MEMBER WILSON MOVED, COUNCIL MEMBER HILTY SECONDED a motion to approve the August 24, 2020 Land Use Planning Minutes as presented. All Ayes, MOTION CARRIED.

Department Head Reports:

Police Chief Marty Noonan reported 26 calls for the month. There was one arrest and a stolen car recovery. Mr. Noonan said the annual Sturgis Motorcycle Rally was about the same crowd as last year which was a good turnout in this year of the pandemic. No incidents took place.

City Clerk Treasurer Kathy Lenz reported that a market value for the City lot on the corner of Main and 2nd Street has been received. Discussion was held and City Attorney Mark Hughes explained the process moving forward if the council were interested in selling the property for Economic Development.

Mayor Brooks reported that he and Clerk Treasurer Kathy Lenz met recently with George Byers from Rare Element Resources. Mr. Byers gave an update on the effect of the China market and the progress RER has made on a processing and separation plant. RER hopes to apply for a mine permit possibly within the next couple of years.

City Attorney Hughes reported that the Crook County School has made an offer on the Sewell Street Nuisance property. There has not been any response from the property owner at this time. Mayor Brooks commented that the nuisance will be cleaned up one way or another.
