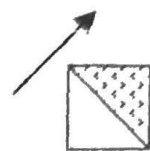


## Step 6 – Undercover in Houston VII

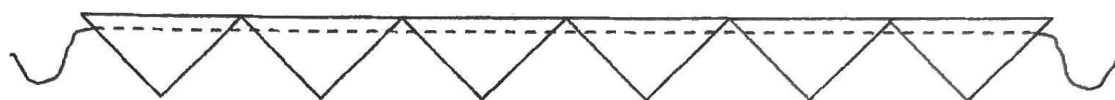
Place a  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " ( $3\frac{7}{8}$ ") square of fabric #1 neatly onto a  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " ( $3\frac{7}{8}$ ") square of fabric #2, right sides together.

Cut the pair of squares once, diagonally, to make two pairs of half-square triangles. Repeat with the remaining  $4\frac{7}{8}$ " ( $3\frac{7}{8}$ ") squares to make a total of forty-eight pairs of half-square triangles.

Chain piece the units along the diagonal. Press the seam allowances toward fabric #2. Trim the dog ears.

## Step 7 – Undercover in Houston VII

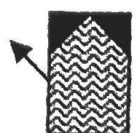
Use the sew and flip technique that was described in Step 4, and the C and D units from Step 4 for this step.

Place a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (2") square of fabric #4 on an adjacent corner of a C unit. Stitch on the diagonal of the small square as shown by the dotted line. Check your work. If it is correct, trim away the excess, leaving  $\frac{1}{4}$ " for seam allowance, as shown by the solid line. Press the seam allowances toward fabric #4. Repeat to complete the twenty-eight C units.

Use the sew and flip technique to complete the ten D units with  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (2") squares of fabric #4. Refer to the drawing directly at the right to determine the corner where you should apply the square.
