Fun with your Cutter – Working with Card Stock and Pens! with Jerry Hunter and Elaine O’Hanlon

Join Jerry Hunter and Elaine O’Hanlon as we use our cutters to cut card stock to make greeting cards and gift tags. We will also use the pen adapter for your cutter machine to draw and write on the card stock.

For this class you will need to have the appropriate pen adapter for your machine. The kit fee for this class is \$10.00 and includes the card stock and designs for the cards/tags shown. We will have pens in class for you to use, however if you have specific colors or types of pens you would like to use, please bring your own pens in.



Supplies Needed

- Brother Scan N Cut, Silhouette Cameo or Cricut Air or Maker cutting machine with all cords and cables (please be sure your cutting machine has been updated with the latest firmware updates) ✓
- Cutting Mat and weeding tools of your choice. ✓
- Laptop computer (for Silhouette Cameo and Cricut users)
- Silhouette Studio software installed on your computer (for Cameo users) or Design Space (for Cricut users)
- A flash drive so we can give you the design for your cutting machine. ✓
- Pen adapter for your machine (Brother pen adapters are available for purchase as DSC. We do not have adapters for the Silhouette. The Cricut Maker does not require an adapter)

- Pens to fit your adapter if you would like to use your own specific colors or type of pen.
- Light tack cutting mat, or regular cutting mat that has been used. Card stock and paper tend to stick to mats, which could render your project unsuccessful.
- Weeding tools and spatula or scraping tool.
- Brayer to flatten the card stock to your mat. (optional)
