In-the-Hoop (ITH) Cork Fabric Coaster, Bookmark, and Name Tag

Make all these current, trendy, in-the-hoop (ITH) items from cork fabric, which is also currently trendy. This hands-on class is a great opportunity for beginning embroiderers and seasoned stitchers alike! You will be walked step-by-step through the process of creating each item. (Samples pictures are at the end of the Supply List on page 3 for an optional print out!)

Supplies Needed

Fabrics:

- If you are intending to make more than just one coaster, you need at least **1/3 yd.** of Cork Fabric – 12” in length x 54” in width if you purchase from Hobby Lobby, **OR 5/8 yd.** of 27” Cork Fabric **if** you can find it at a Joann’s store (they don’t ship cork fabric), **OR** if you only want to make the three items in class for the experience, you can purchase a “kit” from me for \$2.00 that will have enough cork fabric for the three items we’re creating. Please let me know by **Jan. 3, 2020**, if you want to purchase a “kit” from me.
- If you are NOT purchasing the “kit,” the cut measurements needed to assemble these three projects in class are as follows: The coaster—two 5” x 5” squares; the bookmark—two pieces 2 ½” x 5”; the name tag—two pieces 2 ½” x 5”.

Stabilizers:

- Enough Wet ‘n Gone for two layers (or one layer doubled) for one 4” x 4” hooping for the name tag (or more if you choose to use a larger hoop). If you are making the satin stitched edge coaster, you need Floriani Wet ‘n Gone for two layers (or one layer doubled) for a 6” x 6” hoop **or** a 5” x 7” hoop, and enough for two layers (or one layer doubled) for a 5” x 7” hoop for the bookmark. ✓
- 1 piece of Floriani Medium Tearaway for a 5” x 7” hoop or a 6” x 6” hoop **if** you are making the pinked-edge finish coaster. ✓
- 1 piece 2 ½” x 4 ½” of OESD Fuse and Seal Stabilizer or Floriani Press N Bond for the bookmark. This stabilizer piece will be included in the “kit” if you purchase that. Otherwise, the OESD Fuse and Seal stabilizer will be available to purchase in class, either the small piece or by the sheet (8 1/2” x 11”).

Notions:

- 1 piece of Fold Over Elastic at least 14” in length for a paperback book; a longer piece for a larger book.
- Embroidery needle size 75/11 ✓
- Temporary marking pen. ✓
- Embroidery threads to coordinate with your design choices, as many as your designs require. ✓
- 3 different bobbins, depending on your color choices for the three items: ✓
 1. One bobbin with basic embroidery bobbin thread or use a pre-wound. ✓
 2. Wind one bobbin to match the top thread for the finished satin stitched edge coaster unless you’re making the pinked-edge version. In that case you need a matching top and bottom thread that coordinates with the cork fabric to stitch the outer circle before pinking.
 3. Wind one bobbin to match the top thread for the finished satin stitched edge of the name tag.
- In-the-Hoop Applique Scissors for trimming appliqué; embroidery scissors for trimming threads; scissors for trimming away stabilizer. ✓
- Pinking shears for creating the pinked edge on the coaster if you choose that finish. I will also bring my pairs of pinking shears to class for you to use during club.
- Temporary adhesive spray and/or embroidery tape. ✓

- A badge clip for the name tag will be provided for you at class. There will also be a buttonhole cutter available to use in class on the name tag as well. If you'd rather wear the name tag around your neck, you need to buy ribbon or some sort of chain that you can loop through the buttonhole to be able to wear it around your neck.

Machine & Accessories:

- Embroidery machine in good working order with manual, power cord, embroidery foot. ✓
- Hoops: At least a 5" x 7" for the bookmark project; a 5" x 7" OR a 6" x 6" (150 mm x 150 mm) hoop for the coaster; a 4" x 4" hoop will be large enough for the name tag but you can choose to use one of the larger hoops if you wish. ✓
- USB Stick to load the project design. ✓
