

Serger Strip Scarf

Turn those fabric scraps into a wonderful gift for someone special....Gather your extra strips of fabric and your Serger and join us as we strip together a whimsical scarf! Treat yourself to a new accessory, or get an early start on your holiday sewing! This is a great project for any level and a perfect way to use those precious scraps you have been saving.

Supplies Needed

- Your serger✓
- 1 cone Maxi Lock thread ✓
- 2 spools sulky Blendables Thread ✓
- Fray Check or similar seam sealant ✓
- Hand sewing needles ✓
- Fabric strips. Vary the fabric types and lengths. Light to midweight fabrics are best. Silks, linens and yarn dyed plaids. Any fabric without a discernible right and wrong side is best for the majority of the fabrics. For example, I used 3 fabrics with a right and wrong side and 8 fabrics with no right or wrong side. Six of my strips were 18" x 2" and five of my strips were 60" x 2" or 3". Shorter strips can be tied together after serging the edges.

I found the Sulky Blendables thread helped tie the various fabrics together nicely.

We will be using a Three Thread Overlock Narrow stitch, Maxi Lock in the right needle and Sulky Blendables in the upper and lower loopers.
