



## **BEGINNING HAND APPLIQUÉ SUPPLY LIST (2/5/18)**

(No sewing machine required)

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**Method:** Starting out with the basics, beginners learn this easy freezer paper appliqué method with great results. After the blocks are prepared they can be hand or machine appliquéd - hand appliqué will be demonstrated in class. Start to learn the techniques with a Butterfly.

**What to bring:** See Supply list for tools - **Butterfly pattern to be supplied by teacher.**

**Bring a lunch** or snacks because class usually goes from 10am-3pm.

**For practice on the butterfly block:** Bring the following Fabric & Threads -

- Background fabric cut to approximately 13" x 13" or at least 1" larger than needed in each direction. The background fabric must contrast with the appliqué fabrics you select for the butterfly. See sample in shop for ideas.
- Scraps of small print fabrics (scraps can be as small as 10" square) - any 3 fabrics you want to use for butterfly wings (good contrast between each wing section and the background is needed). Also, one fabric for butterfly body and antennae. Batiks are great and ravel less, too.
- Threads to match your fabric choices will be needed when you are ready to sew your block. I use fine cotton machine embroidery thread (50 wt. two-ply) for hand appliqué.

### **BASIC APPLIQUÉ SUPPLY LIST**

This is a list of commonly used appliqué tools. The first three tools listed (shown with \*) are **required**. Each student must have their own, no sharing.

- \*Small craft or travel iron (I use a small travel iron - Clover Brand)
- \*Firm ironing surface (I use the 12" by 12" June Taylor® Cut'N Press I)
- \*Appliqué stiletto (sharp metal pointed stylus)
- 1/4" stencil brush or other small paint brush (any brand not a plastic brush)
- Spray starch (spray starch in the can - not Fabric Sizing or liquid starch)
- Small container for starch (plastic container or jar with a tight-fitting lid)
- Roxanne's Glue Baste It® (this is water soluble basting glue)
- Scissors (a pair for cutting paper and a pair for cutting fabric)
- Emery board (like the kind used to file finger nails)
- Freezer paper (Reynolds® or pre-cut 8 1/2" x 11" sheets by C. Jenkins)
- Identa pen - non-smearing permanent marker
- Straw needles #11 for hand appliqué
- Fine cotton machine embroidery thread - 50 wt/2 ply (not embroidery floss)
- Aleene's OK to Wash-It Glue (permanent, clear drying fabric glue)

#### **Optional supplies:**

- Parchment Paper to protect overlay pattern
- Piece of scrap muslin (13" x 13") to cover ironing surface
- OTT light or small table light
- Thimble and needle threader (if you use them)
- Thread Heaven® thread conditioner
