





Tucker University Mission

The mission of Tucker University is to assist shop owners and quilt instructors in providing the best educational experience when teaching how to fully use any of the Studio 180 Design tools and techniques.

Tucker University offers a teaching curriculum for technique and project-based classes. The duration of the classes are typically 3 or 4 hours depending on the class objective. Technique classes are single-day courses. Project-based classes, such as in the Junior year, are multiple-day sessions.

Classes are supported with a teaching packet. Teaching packets have been developed using educationally researched based methods. The teaching packet allows the instructor to focus their efforts on promoting classes and creating samples rather than planning and preparing for class. 
Tucker University Curriculum Purchasing Options


There are 4 years of curriculum currently available: Freshmen, Sophomore, Junior, and Senior year.

The Tucker University can be purchased in a sequential manner using an auto ship membership or in an à la carte manner.

The **Membership** option is the best investment. It is a one-time fee. The Membership option ensures that you have a full sequence of courses that cover the Studio 180 design tools and techniques. You will be shipped one lesson each month which includes the teaching packet along with a minimum of 6 corresponding design sheets for a year until you have received all 12 lessons plus the bonus lesson. Once you have acquired the curriculum, you are welcome to repeat the lessons and order additional design sheets as needed.

The à la carte option allows you to purchase individual lessons of your choosing. Each lesson will include the teaching packet along with 6 design sheets for that specific course. These lessons can be repeated as much as you desire. Keep in mind, the lessons specifically in the freshmen year, are sequential and do build from the previous lesson. The sophomore year can easily be separated into semester 1 and 2. Each project in the junior year can be a stand-alone event creating a series of 3 classes.





Freshman Curriculum

The Freshman year curriculum is an excellent **starting point for students** to become familiar with the Studio 180 Design philosophy of oversizing the unit and then trimming to precision. This curriculum supports the instruction of being able to identify basic quilting units by name and how to combine units to design individual blocks.

Most of the freshman year **classes are 3-4 hours in length**. Students improve their piecing skills using practice fabric or create a sampler project of their own. Each course requires the student to purchase the corresponding Design Sheet to support their learning.

Layout Design Sheets

Layout Design Sheets should be a part of every quilter's resource binder. Layout Design Sheets provide the quilter with ideas on how to arrange 12" finished blocks in either straight rows or in an on-point arrangement, with or without sashing. The best part is that the Layout Design Sheets provide the quilter with fabric requirements for each layout. There is a Layout Design Sheet for quilts projects in the following sizes: Table Runner, Crib, Throw, Twin, Queen, or King.



Sophomore Curriculum

The Sophomore year curriculum offers the opportunity to **continue building piecing techniques** during the first semester followed by the School of Design. The second semester, or School of Design, is when students **design their own quilt top** with the guidance of the instructor using the Studio 180 Design tools and techniques of their choice. These semesters are not dependent upon each other, so you could jump to second semester if you wanted to do so.

Sophomore year **classes are 3–4 hours in length** with the option to continue with open sew time. It is strongly recommended for students to have completed all or most of the Freshman curriculum to participate in the School of Design. Freshman-year Design Sheets are used during the School of Design.

Course Description for each course

<u>1-101 Tucker Trimmer I[®] and Shaded Four Patch</u> Learn how to use a Tucker Trimmer I[®] to create half square triangles, quarter square triangles, and combination units. With the Tucker Trimmer I[®] alone, a quilter can make three (3) different units in 11 different sizes. These units are often what we refer to as basic units, therefore they must be precise to fit nicely with more advanced units. This is a perfect place for any quilter to begin their journey through the Studio 180 Design set of tools.

You will also learn how to expand the use of your Tucker Trimmer $I^{\$}$ by creating a Shaded Four Patch unit. By using Deb Tucker's method of strip piecing the construction of a shaded-four patch, the quilter eliminates the need to stitch fabrics on an unsecured bias. This method also eliminates the stretching and puckering within the unit. Quilters will use their Tucker Trimmer $I^{\$}$ to finalize their units and then discover a wide array of layouts that can be created with just one block.

Fabric Requirements: Fabrics will be cut during class. Therefore, the fabric requirements are healthy amounts so that you can make your own design choices during class.

For course 1-101, we recommend the following yardage:

3/8 yard Focal Fabric


3/8 yard Background

1/4 yard of a coordinating or contrasting fabric with the focal fabric

1/4 yard of a coordinating or contrasting fabric with the focal fabric

Lesson Plan for each course



30 min

Students return to their work station to create half square triangles. We would like them to make at least 4 half square triangles in about the next 30 minutes.

This is a good time to do small group demos, when it comes time to trim down the unit.

Teaching Note: The half square triangle units ARE NOT to be trimmed down. The trim down process will come after the students have stitched a half square triangle to a full square. Then they will trim the unit apart, press it and make a final trim down to the required cut size.

If we needed to make (4) half square triangles, how many squares of fabric do we start with? **Answer:** (2) two of each color



Since you just shared your block, what would happen if you took out a unit or two of the current units and replaced them with the next class's unit? In this case, that would be a few V-blocks?

Junior Curriculum

The Junior year curriculum is all **project-based classes** including the opportunity to learn how to use additional tools and techniques from Studio 180 Design. Junior year students should be confident quilters.

Each project is designed as 3 classes, 4-hours in duration. Students will have homework to complete to be prepared for the next lesson. It is recommended that each project be offered as a 3-month series or a 3-day retreat project.

Each project comes with a **teaching packet** that includes the supply list for each project and lesson plan for the instructor. Each student is to **purchase a corresponding design sheet** which includes the fabric requirements, cutting instructions, and layout diagrams for several different-sized projects.

Junior Year Purchasing Options

The Junior Year curriculum can be purchased in three different options: à la carte, 4-project membership, or 6-project membership. The **à la carte** method allows you to purchase individual projects at any time. The **4-project membership** allows you to select any 4 of the 6 projects to create a full year of course offerings. The **6-project membership** gives you all 6 projects to offer 18 months of classes.

Each student needs to purchase the corresponding Design Sheet for fabric requirements, cutting instructions, and layout options in addition to any required Studio 180 Design tools and/or technique sheets.

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Senior Curriculum

The Senior curriculum should come with a warning label, "This tool can be addictive!" The Star 60™ tool makes working with 60° angles a breeze. There is so much that a quilter can do with the Star 60 tool that Tucker University devotes most of the Senior year to just this one tool.

A Course description for each class is available in the Shop Owner's guide that comes with your full year membership. Each class comes with the teaching packet that includes the student supply list with precutting instructions and the instructor's lesson plan. Each student is to purchase the corresponding Tucker University Design Sheet for additional design inspiration.

Classes have been designed as a 3-hour session. Students can save their blocks throughout the year to create a final project with multiple layout options or create their own projects as the year progresses.

Senior Year Purchasing Option

The Senior year curriculum has been written in a sequential manner where students will build upon their previous learned skills as they progress through each lesson. Individual lessons can be purchased on an à la carte basis; however, for best results Tucker University encourages the Senior year to be taught in a full year sequence.

Each student will need to purchase the required Studio 180 Design tools and technique sheets along with the Tucker University Design Sheet per class.

The Tucker University Tag Along Series is twice the fun of a block of the month program. It's two blocks a month for a total of 24 blocks in a full year.




