

SPINNING PINWHEELS

Although this is a serger class, you will also be using your sewing machine for a large part of this project. The serger is used as a means of embellishing your pinwheels.

Serger

Sewing machine

Power cords and feet for your machines

¼" foot for your sewing machine (#37, #57, #97)

Serger thread – use decorative threads such as variegated colors, metallic, or Halo

Serger thread – one spool or more of a needle thread and possibly one for a looper

Sewing thread – metrosene or Silk Finish, your choice to contrast or match

Book – “Serge and Merge Quilts” by Sharon V. Rotz

Fabrics:

2 Fat quarters for background – two different fabrics

2 Fat quarters for the pinwheels and borders – one a solid, one a print

Ruler and rotary cutter

If you want to cut your fabrics before class, I would like you to cut all of your pieces on the lengthwise grain of the fat quarters; there is no reason to cut these into the smaller 4.5 inch or 2 ¼ inch pieces yet.

Also just cut your background pieces into just the 10 inch squares. You will cut 4 strips at 2 ½” width and 3 – 2 ¼” strips all on the lengthwise grain; this should leave a piece for testing your serger.

Class Policy:
