### UDOT I-15 Lane Addition

The UDOT I-15 lane addition is getting underway and may cause some traffic delays. ### 3-Story Medical Building

Brigham City Community Hospital has begun construction of a new medical office building which will be at the south end of the existing hospital. The construction is anticipated to last 10 to 12 months. During this time, a temporary sidewalk has been created.
