Double trash pickup begins April 24 and runs through May 12, 2017. During this time residents may place their trash cans out the day after normal trash collection day for an extra pickup during the week.

We will also be having our annual Community Pride Cleanup campaign which will begin Saturday April 29 and run through Sunday May 7, 2017. This cleanup helps residents to dispose of items that are too large to put in residential containers. All such items should be taken to 1650 West Forest Street (the old compost site) between the hours of 7a.m. and 7p.m. This service is only for residents of Brigham City. No commercial dumping will be allowed AND proof of residency will be required.

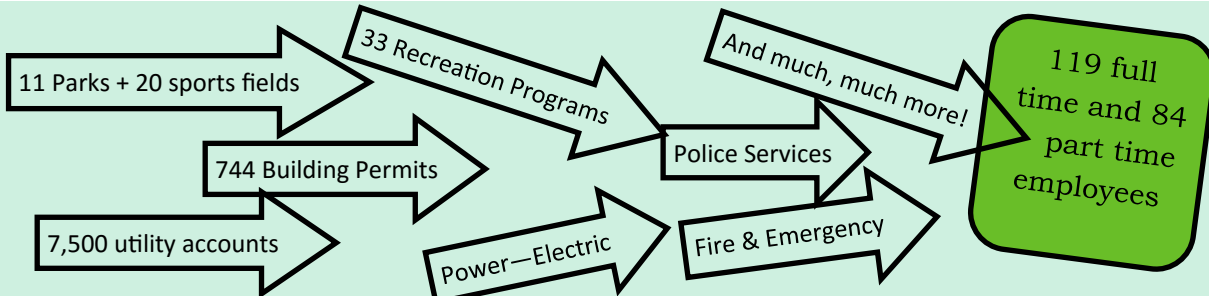
Along with Springtime comes the season of construction. Please be aware that crews will be out working on improving and repairing our City streets.
