

What's the Rule?

Q: After a snow storm, how long do I have before I need to move my vehicle off the street?

A: In Brigham City it is unlawful to park or leave any vehicle on the street anytime snow removal is taking place. Essentially, if the weather prediction is that a snow storm is coming, please move your vehicles off the street.

Q: What if my neighbor leaves their vehicle out in the street? Can I call and report that?

A: Yes, you can call the non-emergency dispatch line and make a report, however, our plow drivers do pay attention to what vehicles are left for periods of time and report them to the Police Department.

Q: What can happen if I leave my vehicle out at the curb?

A: The vehicle can be towed at the owner's expense and/or the owner cited for failure to comply with the ordinance.

More importantly, the plow drivers cannot do the best snow removal job when they have to swing out to miss cars at the curb.
