


Mayor's Message Summertime

The Brigham City Splash Pad at John Adams Park is up and running every day from 9am to 9pm. Bring your family (and your towels) and come have some summertime fun!



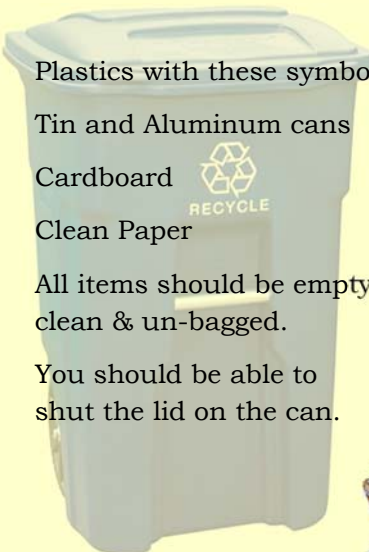
This might interest you
