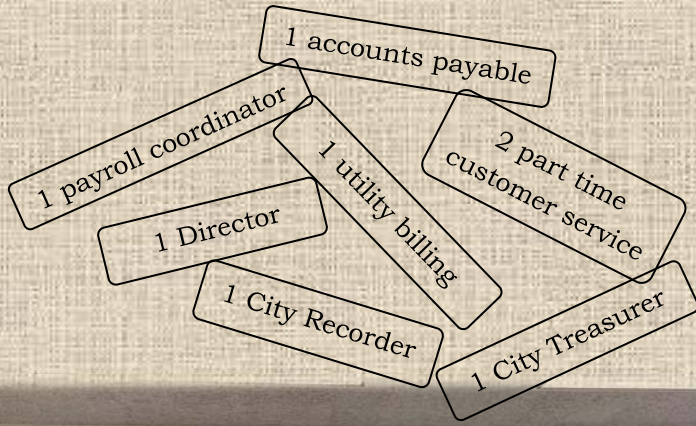


Finance & Administration Department
