#### BEAR RIVER HEALTH DEPARTMENT UPDATES:

Bear River Health Department's most recent Public Health Order allows certain places of business, including gyms, to open if they follow proper public health protocols. The gym cannot allow any employee or customer that presents any symptom consistent with COVID-19 to be in the facility. Only 1 individual per 100 square feet will be allowed and there must be at least 10 feet of separation between patrons. No team or group activities are allowed. Locker room and shower areas shall not be used. All equipment shall be disinfected after each use. It is also recommended that individuals over the age of 60 and individuals who are immunocompromised not use the facility.

## DID YOU KNOW?


Bear River Health Department follows CDC guidelines to determine when individuals may discontinue isolation. Persons with COVID-19 who have symptoms may discontinue isolation under the following conditions:

- At least 3 days (72 hours) have passed since recovery (defined as resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications); and
- Improvement in respiratory symptoms; and
- At least 7 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.

Alternatively, an individual may discontinue isolation if:



- Resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medication; and
- Improvement in respiratory symptoms; and
- Negative results of an FDA Emergency Use Authorized molecular assay for COVID-19 from at least two consecutive nasopharyngeal swab specimens collected  $\geq 24$  hours apart.
