DID YOU KNOW?

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has provided new guidance on the use of cloth face coverings to help slow the spread of COVID-19. The CDC recommends wearing cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain, especially in areas of significant community-based transmission. The CDC also advises the use of simple cloth face coverings to slow the spread of the virus and help people who may have the virus and do not know it from transmitting it to others. The CDC reminds us that this is an additional, voluntary public health measure.

The cloth face coverings are not surgical masks or N-95 respirators. Those are critical supplies that must continue to be reserved for healthcare workers and other medical first responders. For more information on cloth face coverings please visit www.cdc.gov.
