
DID YOU KNOW?

Shortage of Personal Protective Equipment

On March 23, the Bear River Health Department received our first shipment of personal protective equipment (PPE) from the Strategic National Stockpile. It included four pallets of masks, gloves, face shields and gowns for hospitals, long-term care facilities, and EMS agencies with transport licenses. Several EMS agencies, clinics, homecare and hospice programs, jails and law enforcement agencies did not receive anything. The health department has been monitoring the inventories at several agencies and responding, when possible, with small amounts of needed PPE. Today, a much-anticipated second shipment arrived, but it only had three boxes of face shields and three boxes of gowns. This week, the health department will start distributing what little supply of PPE it has to those agencies



that need it. We will at least try to provide some masks to each organization that did not receive any previous supplies. In the meantime, organizations are encouraged to continue trying to obtain PPE through other sources because little, if any, is expected to come through state or federal channels in the upcoming weeks.
