### Situation in Bear River Health District

#### CUMULATIVE LAB-CONFIRMED POSITIVE COVID-19 STATISTICS

Note – the numbers of cases and individuals hospitalized is cumulative and doesn’t represent current infections or hospitalizations. Recovered individuals have been fever free at least 3 days without the use of fever reducing medications, have improvement in respiratory symptoms, and at least 10 days have passed since symptoms first began or a positive test was obtained. Active cases can be calculated by subtracting the recoveries and deaths from the total cases.

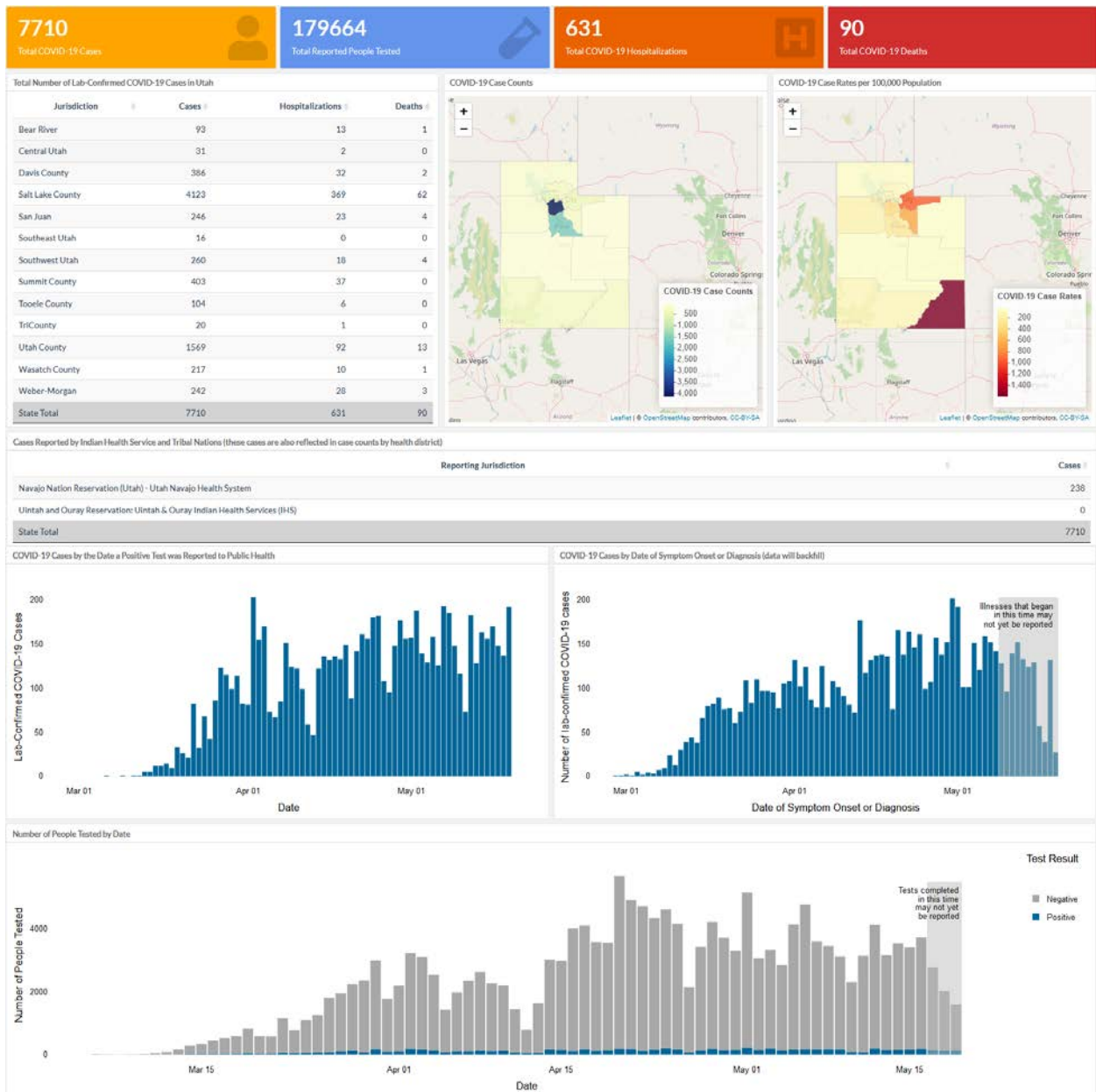
