Situation in Bear River Health District

CUMULATIVE LAB-CONFIRMED POSITIVE COVID-19 STATISTICS

Note – the numbers of cases and individuals hospitalized is cumulative and doesn't represent current infections or hospitalizations. Recovered individuals have been fever free at least 3 days without the use of fever reducing medications, have improvement in respiratory symptoms, and at least 10 days have passed since symptoms first began or a positive test was obtained. Active cases can be calculated by subtracting the recoveries and deaths from the total cases.

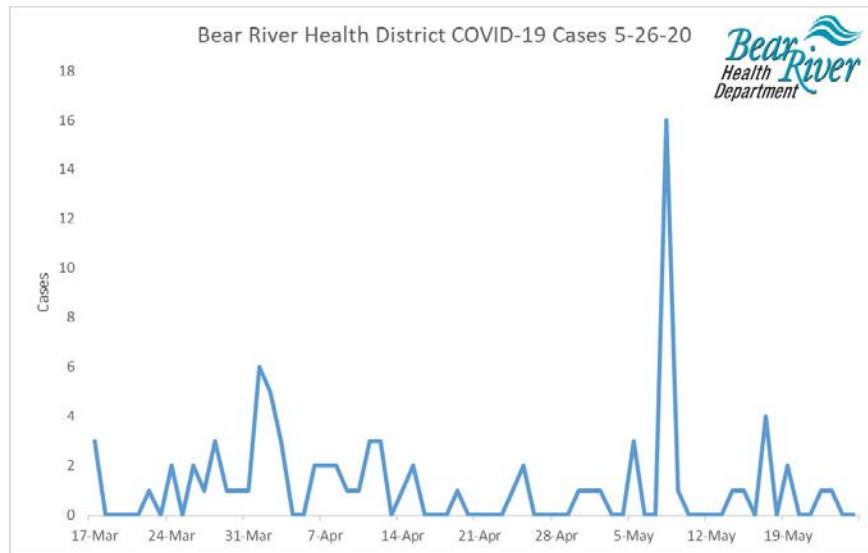

BEAR RIVER HEALTH DEPARTMENT UPDATES

Bear River Health Department announced the first death of a Cache County resident from COVID-19 over the weekend. The individual was a female, over the age of 60, and was tested, treated, and passed away outside of Cache County.

As of May 26, 2020 we have performed 6,352 COVID-19 tests in our district. This provides us with an overall positive rate of 1.67%.
