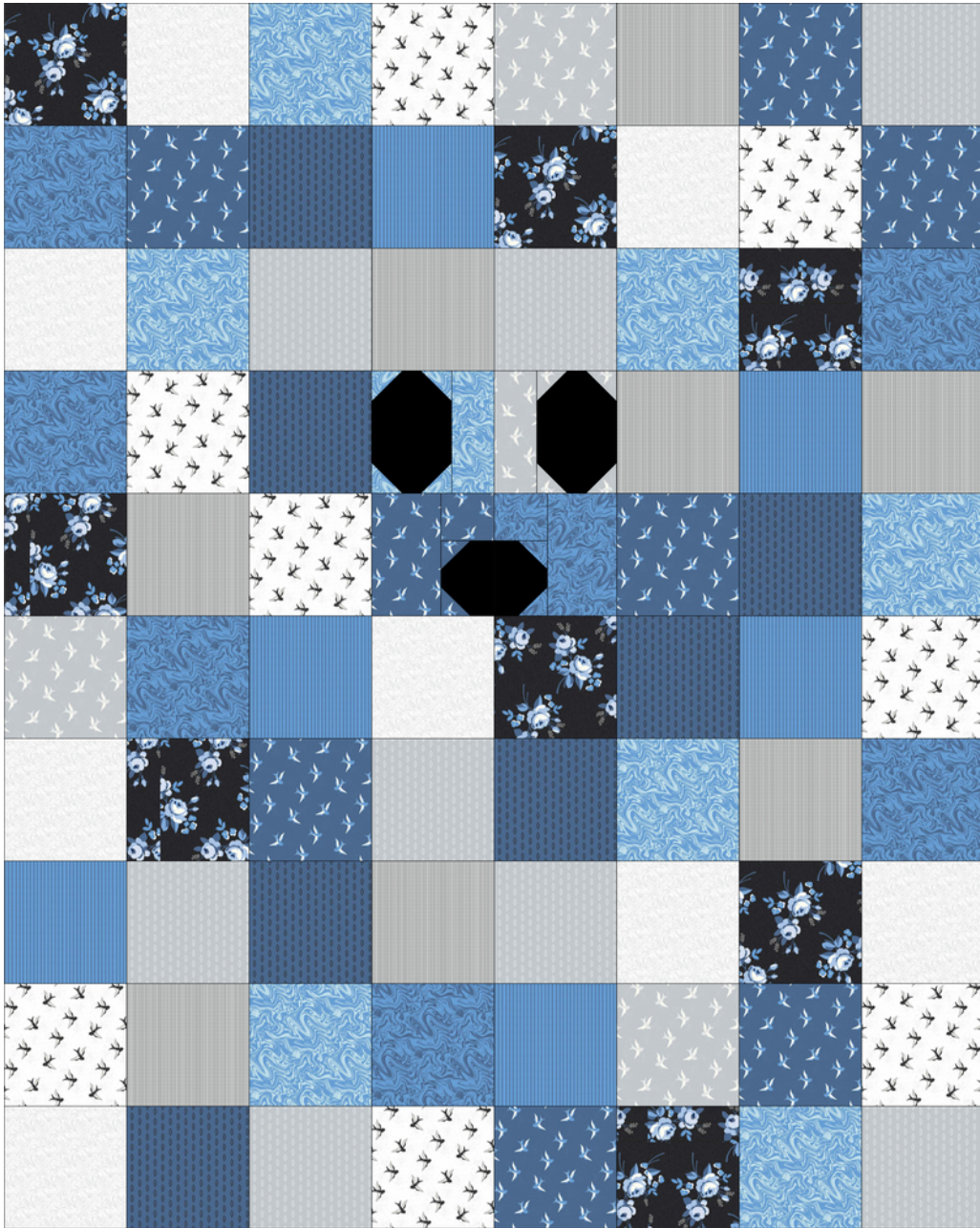

Before Getting Started

- This pattern has two versions: one with the face blocks and one without.
- This quilt uses a 1/4" seam allowance.
- WOF means Width of Fabric and assumes the fabric is 42" wide.
- Read all of the instructions before starting.

Fabric Requirements

Cutting Instructions

	WITHOUT FACE BLOCK	WITH FACE BLOCK
Fabric A	N/A	See Page 3
Fabric B	N/A	(1) 3 1/4" x 21" strip subcut into (2) 3 1/4" x 5" rectangles and (2) 3 1/4" x 2 1/4" rectangles.
Binding	(5) 2 1/2" x WOF strips	(5) 2 1/2" X WOF strips

Cutting Instructions for Fabric A

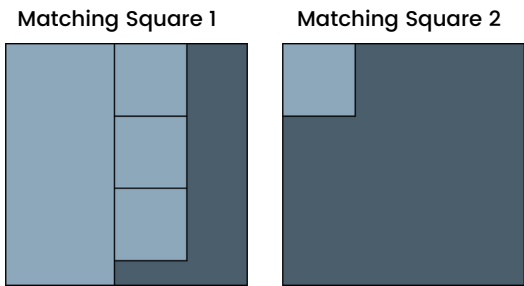
Fabric A1	(1) 2 1/4" x 5" rectangle and (4) 1 1/2" squares
Fabric A2	(1) 2 1/4" x 5" rectangle and (4) 1 1/2" squares
Fabric A3	(1) 3 1/4" x 5" rectangle, (1) 2 1/4" square and (2) 1 1/2" squares
Fabric A4	(1) 3 1/4" x 5" rectangle, (1) 2 1/4" square and (2) 1 1/2" squares

Face Block Cutting Diagram

The face block is made up of 4 sections: left eye, right eye, left mouth and right mouth. Each section will use (2) matching 5" charm squares. Choose 4 sets of 2 duplicate prints to use for each section of the face and label according to the Fabric Requirements Chart. If you do not have duplicate prints, choose 2 similar prints for each section of the face.

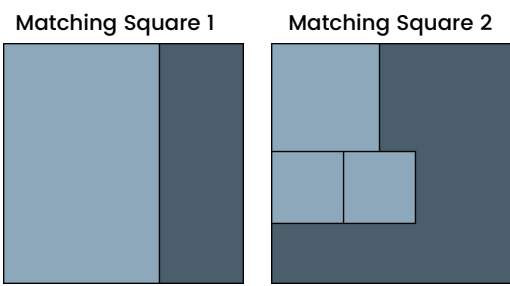
FABRIC A - EYE BLOCKS

Cut these pieces from the A1 and A2 pairs of duplicate prints. Keep the same print pieces together because one print will be used for the left eye and one will be used for the right eye.

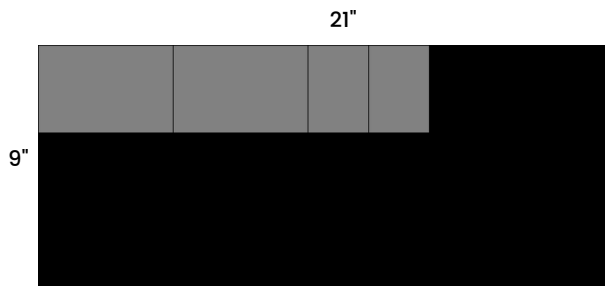


FABRIC A - MOUTH BLOCKS

Cut these pieces from the A3 and A4 pairs of duplicate prints. Keep the same print pieces together because one print will be used for the left mouth and one will be used for the right mouth.

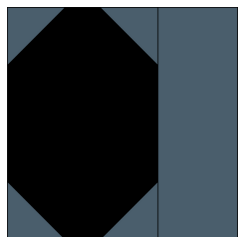


FABRIC B - FACE AND MOUTH BLOCKS

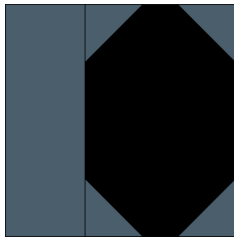


Face Block Assembly Overview

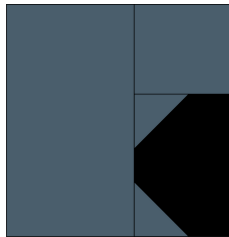
LEFT EYE



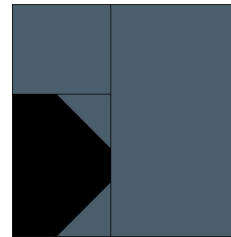
RIGHT EYE



LEFT MOUTH



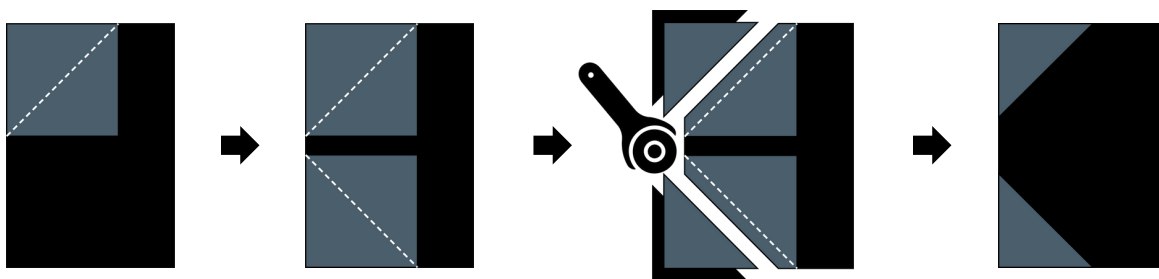
RIGHT MOUTH



Snowball Assembly Method

Use this method when piecing the face block sections.

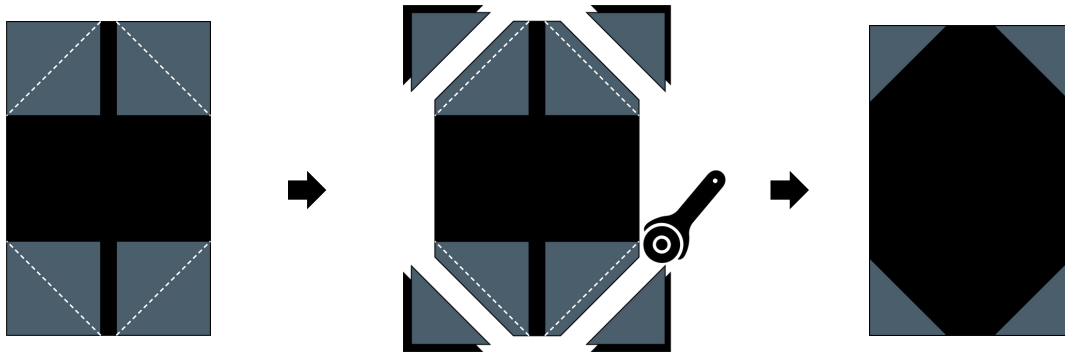
1. Make a diagonal line on each $1\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square.
2. Align the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square in the corner of the Fabric B rectangle with right sides together, with the marked diagonal line not pointing to the corner.
3. Sew the $1\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to the Fabric B rectangle along the marked line. Repeat for each corner as needed.
4. Trim $\frac{1}{4}$ " past the marked line. Discard trimmed pieces.
5. Press seams in the direction of your choosing.



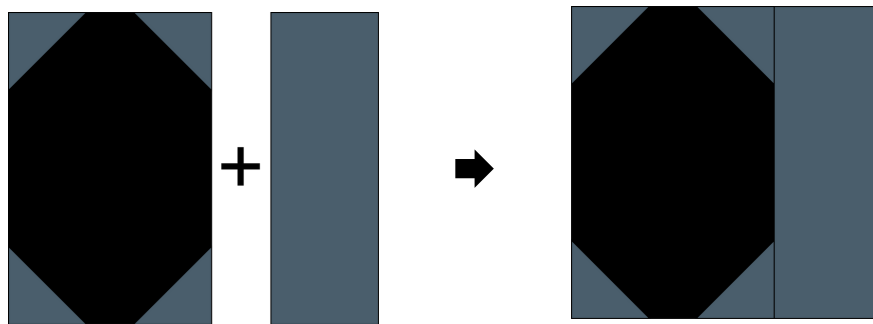
Piecing the Face Block - Eyes

LEFT AND RIGHT EYE BLOCKS

1. Use the snowball assembly method (see Page 4) to attach (4) Fabric A1 $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to each corner of (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5" Fabric B rectangle. This unit will measure $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5".

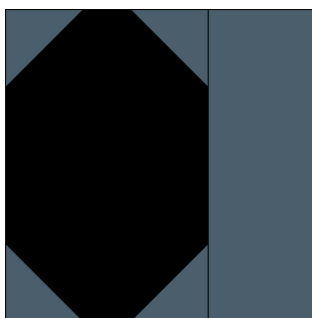


2. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5" Fabric A1 rectangle to the right of the unit in Step 1 as shown below. Press seam in the direction of your choosing. This unit will measure 5" x 5".

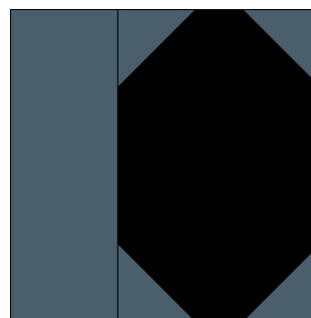


3. Repeat Steps 1 and 2 with the remaining Fabric A2 and Fabric B eye pieces to create 2 matching units. Rotate one of the blocks 180 degrees to get both the left and right eye layouts.

Left Eye Block



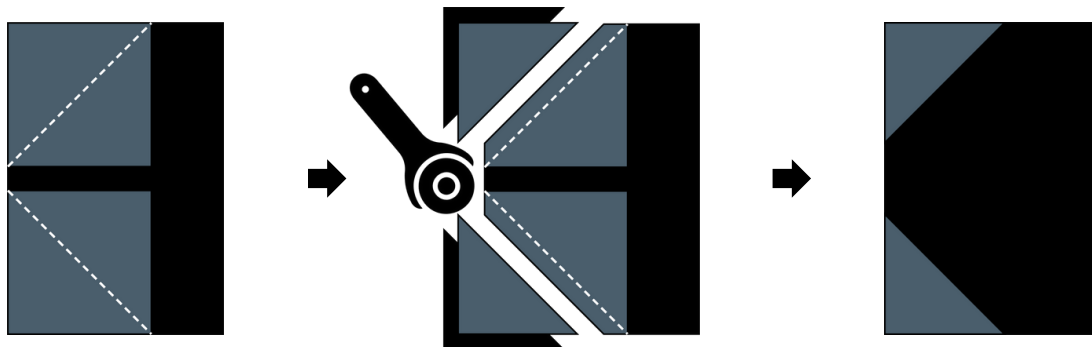
Right Eye Block



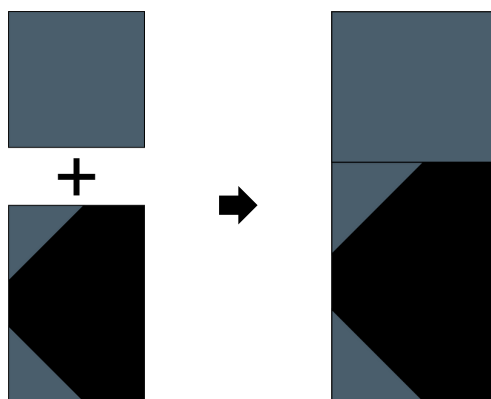
Piecing the Face Block - Mouth

LEFT MOUTH BLOCK

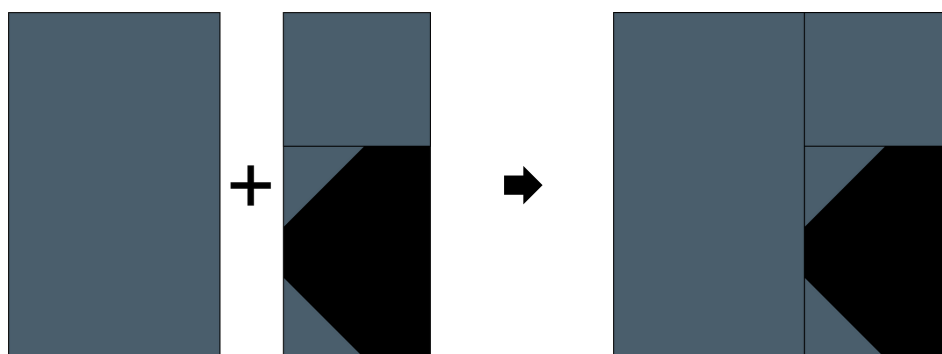
1. Use the snowball assembly method (see Page 4) to attach (2) Fabric A3 $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to the top left and bottom left corners of (1) $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B rectangle as shown below. This unit will measure $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $3\frac{1}{4}$ ".



2. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric A3 square to the top of the unit in Step 1 as shown below. Press seams in the direction of your choosing. This unit will measure $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5".



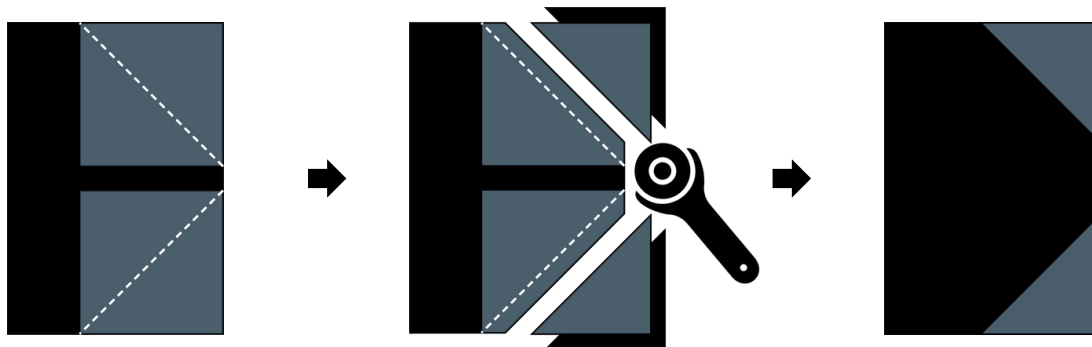
3. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5" Fabric A3 rectangle to the left of the unit in Step 2 as shown below. Press the seam in the direction of your choosing. This unit will measure 5" x 5".



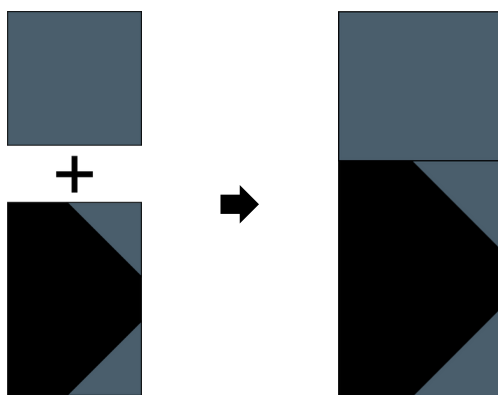
Piecing the Face Block - Mouth

RIGHT MOUTH BLOCK

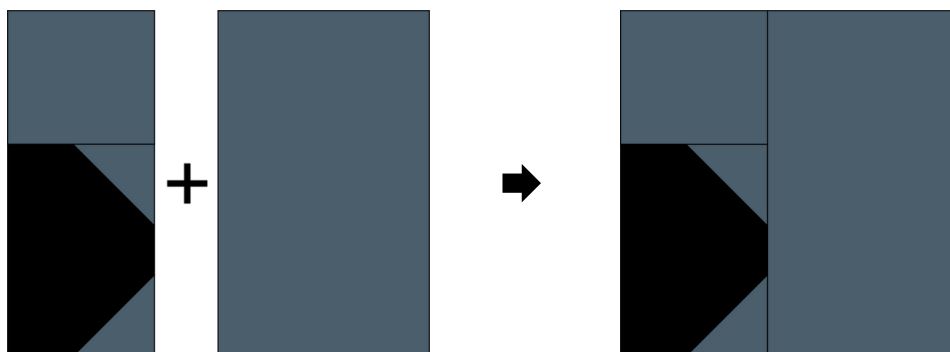
1. Use the snowball assembly method (see Page 4) to attach (2) Fabric A4 $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to the top right and bottom right corners of (1) $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $3\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric B rectangle as shown below. This unit will measure $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x $3\frac{1}{4}$ ".



2. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric A4 square to the top of the unit in Step 1 as shown below. Press seams in the direction of your choosing. This unit will measure $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5".

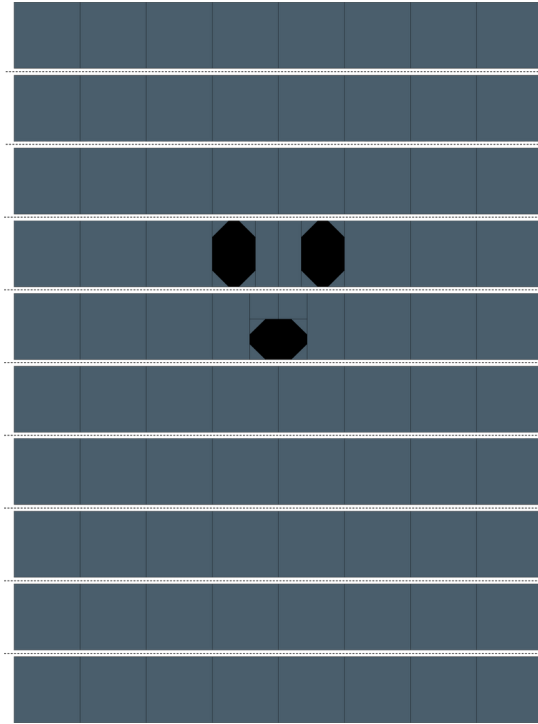


3. Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 5" Fabric A4 rectangle to the right of the unit in Step 2 as shown below. Press the seam in the direction of your choosing. This unit will measure 5" x 5".

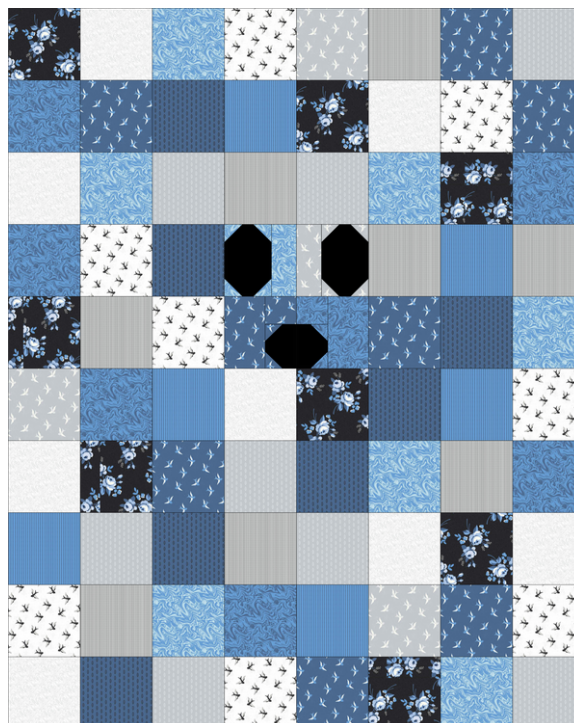


Quilt Top Assembly - With Face Block

1. Sew (8) 5" squares together to make 1 row. **Make 10.** Place the eye blocks and mouth blocks in the center of the rows where you want the face to be. I suggest placing the eye blocks in the center of row 4 and the mouth blocks in the center of row 5. Press the rows in alternating directions.

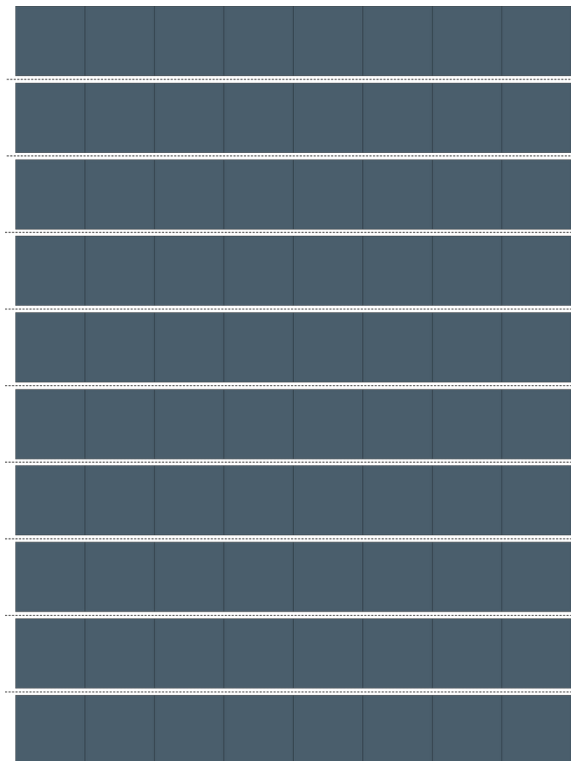


2. Sew the rows together. The seams will nest. The finished quilt top will measure 36" x 45". Press seams in the direction of your choosing.

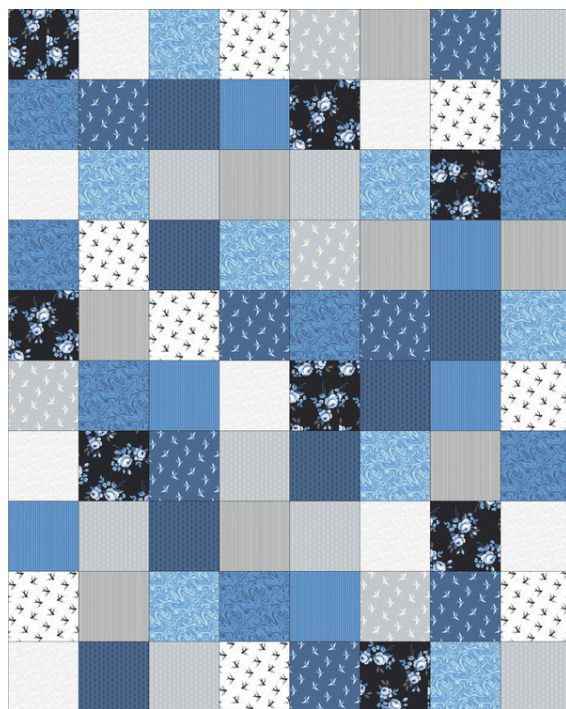


Quilt Top Assembly - Without Face Block

1. Sew (8) 5" Fabric A squares together to make 1 row. **Make 10.** Press the rows in alternating directions.



2. Sew the rows together. The seams will nest. The finished quilt top will measure 36" x 45". Press seams in the direction of your choosing.



Finishing Your Quilt

BACKING:

1. Cut your backing fabric in half to get (2) 54" x WOF pieces. Trim off the selvages.
2. Sew these pieces together along the long (54") sides with 1/2" seam allowance to get (1) piece.
3. The seam will run vertically along the back of the quilt. The assembled backing will measure 83" x 54".

BASTING AND QUILTING:

1. Lay the backing piece right side down, layer on the batting, and then place the quilt top right side up.
2. Baste and quilt as desired.
3. Trim the excess batting and backing from the edges to create a quilt that measures approximately 36" x 45".

BINDING:

1. Join together your binding fabric strips end to end.
2. Press the binding strip in half lengthwise with the wrong sides together.
3. Line up the raw edge of the binding with the raw edge of the quilt. Sew the binding to the quilt.
4. Machine or hand stitch the other edge of the binding to the quilt to finish.
