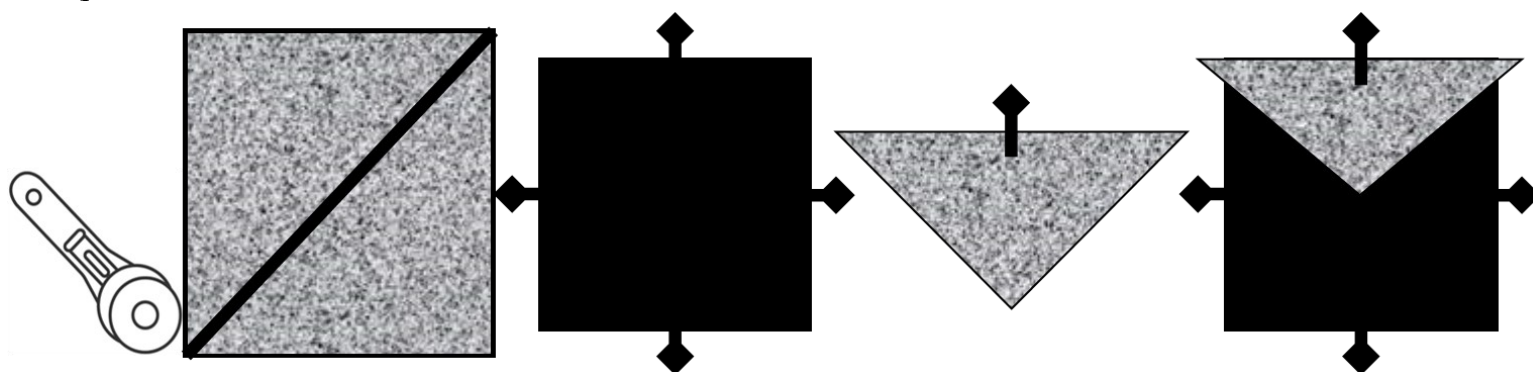

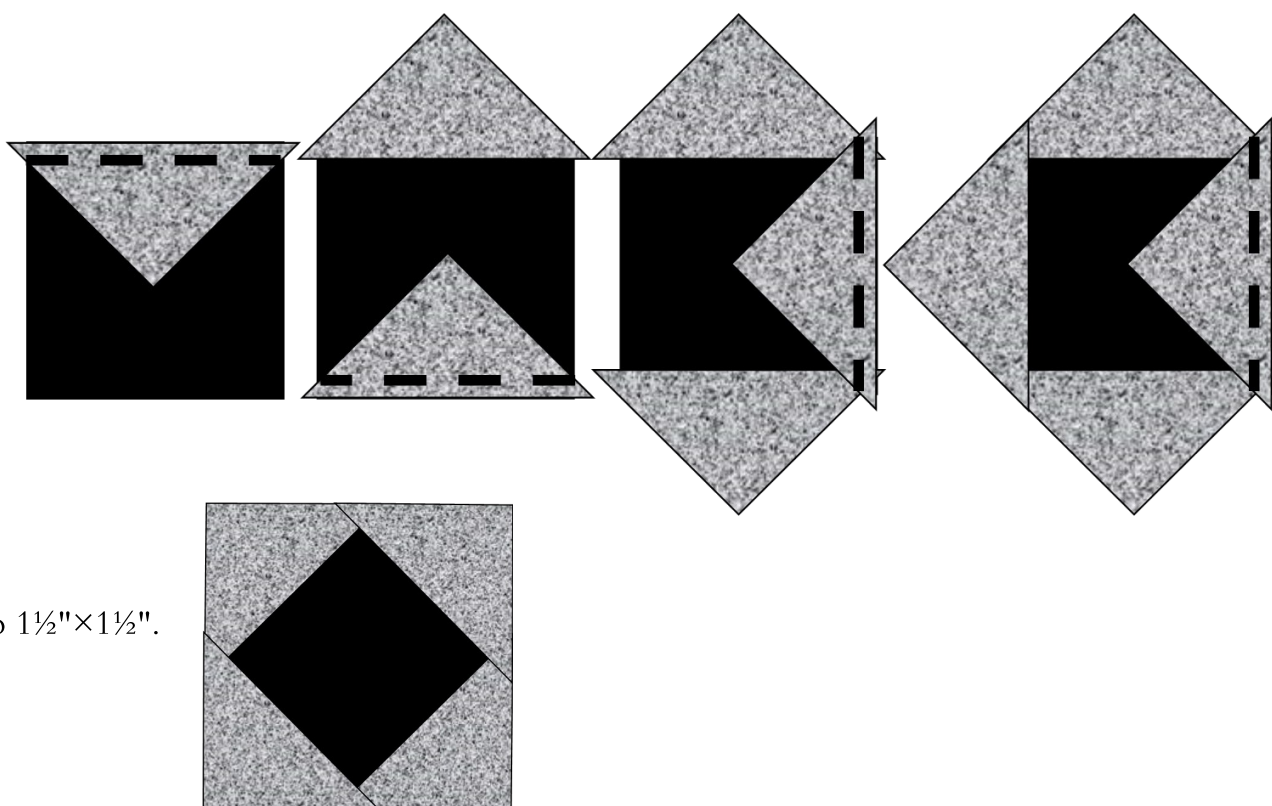
Yellow Fabric	Gray Fabric	Black Fabric	Background Fabric
(2) 1½"×1½" squares	(4) 1½"×1½" squares	(1) 1¼"×1¼" square	(1) 1½"×4½" rectangles
(1) 1½"×3½" rectangle	(2) 1⅜"×1⅜" squares		(3) 1½"×3½" rectangles
(5) 2"×2" squares	(2) 2"×2" squares		(1) 1½"×1½" square
			(4) 2"×2" squares

Square in a Square

1. STARCH your 1⅜" squares before cutting them!
2. Cut (2) 1⅜" squares on the diagonal. Mark the center of the ¼" piece and the center of the triangle. Match the centers with RST.
3. Sew a scant quarter inch from the edge. Your triangle corners should extend ¼" from each side of the square.

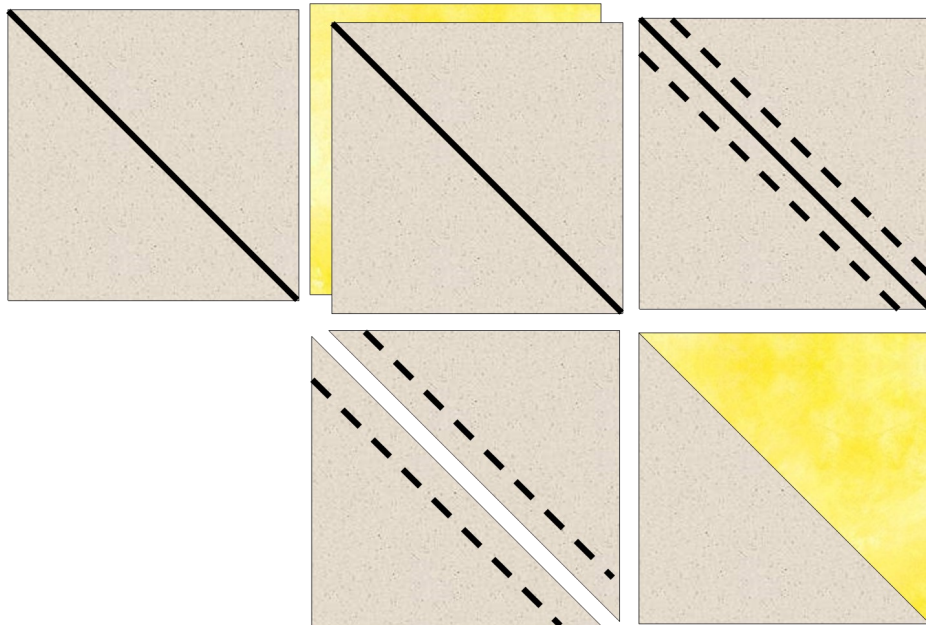


4. Sew the top and bottom, and press seams toward the triangles.
5. Sew the left and right sides, and press seams toward the triangles.
6. Trim blocks to 1½"×1½".



Half Square Triangles

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the 2" background and yellow squares.
2. Pair (2) yellow/background, (1) gray/background, (1) black/background, (2) yellow/black, and (1) yellow/gray fabric squares with RST.
3. Sew a scant quarter inch on both sides of the center line.
4. Cut squares apart on the center line.
5. Press seams toward the print fabric.
6. Trim blocks to $1\frac{1}{2}" \times 1\frac{1}{2}"$.
7. Block count: (4) yellow/background HSTs (one will be leftover); (2) gray/background HSTs; (2) black/background HSTs; (4) yellow/black HSTs (one will be leftover); (2) yellow/gray HSTs



Block Assembly

Layout the block as shown.

Piece together each column with a scant $\frac{1}{4}"$ seam, pressing the seams of each column in opposite directions.

Piece the columns together, pressing the final seams open.

Final size: $6\frac{1}{2}" \times 6\frac{1}{2}"$ unfinished

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
