RECYCLING FAQ'S

Q: Do these items really get recycled?

A: Yes, absolutely. The materials are transported to a recycling center where they are separated via a very sophisticated sorting system, baled by commodity, and distributed to an end user who uses them to manufacture new products.



Q: Why is recycling a good idea?

A: Recycling is good for many reasons. When we recycle, we are keeping these products out of landfills; therefore, lessening the environmental impact and ensuring a cleaner, healthier tomorrow. Recycling allows for products to be manufactured with less raw materials, like water and oil. When we can save these precious raw materials, we are not only manufacturing at a lower cost but we are preserving these valuable materials for a later or more important use down the road.



Q: Isn't recycling time consuming and difficult?

A: No, it's actually quick and easy. Simply empty or spoon clean your recyclables, break down/smash your boxes, and throw all approved recycling items in your blue recycling bin. You don't have to wash out or clean anything. It's as simple as that! DO NOT bag or box your recyclables, leave them loose and toss them in.

Q: What if I need more room than one recycling can?

A: You can have more than one if you need it. Typically, an average household will only need one can if they break down their boxes and smash their jug-like items, making room for all household recyclables. But, if you need an extra can, you can order it through your city's utility department.

Q: Why can't we recycle glass?

A: Glass is recyclable, just not in your All-in-One curbside recycling can. Glass must be recycled only with other glass in special GLASS ONLY bins. Glass cannot go through the sorting facility used for this program.

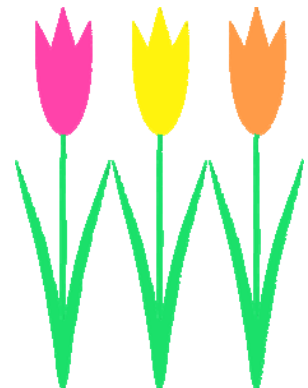

TRAILER ORDINANCE'S

Perry City Ordinance 15.19.060.2 states that "No person shall use a trailer house for sleeping or living purposes or both sleeping and living purposes within Perry City for any period exceeding five (5) days in a thirty (30) day period, except on a mobile home park or trailer park."



PERRY CITY CLEAN-UP

To help facilitate Spring cleaning within the community, large dumpsters will be available starting **April 26th**. Dumping of green waste, concrete, rocks, tires, appliances, or hazardous waste is not allowed.

Violators will be cited if your garbage does not fit or if unallowed items are deposited in the dumpster. DO NOT leave it on the side of the Dumpster, or this program will be discontinued in the future. Dumpsters will be taken away with the 2nd dump. Dumpsters will be placed at the following locations:

- City Hall (3005 S 1200 W)
- Mtn. View Park (2400 S 400 W)
- Dale Young Park (1200 W 2250 S)

SECONDARY WATER WILL BE TURNED ON BY APRIL 15TH

Water will be turned on this year around the 15th. Please be patient if Pine View needs to fix broken lines. We have received little snowfall this year so please remember to conserve water. DO NOT water during daylight hours. **It is illegal to have cross connections with culinary and secondary water.**

All Perry City residents are invited to participate in the 11th Annual Garage Sale. All you have to do to participate is to have a garage sale on **Saturday, May 19th**. "SHAKE OUT" APRIL 19TH.

*The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills. One of the public services that Perry City CERT is coordinating this year is another "Shake Out" emergency simulation exercise. All residents, businesses, and schools in Perry are thus encouraged to participate in a simulated earthquake, which will take place at 10:15 AM on **Thursday April 19th. You can participate in three ways on this day:***

1. *Turn on your local radio or TV station for emergency news.*
2. *At 10:15 AM, "Drop, Cover, and Hold on" in your home or office, as instructed on "Shake Out" websites.*
3. *After 10:15 AM (or before you leave for work, but before 12 Noon), put your "green card" or other "colored card" in your front door or window (so that anyone in front of your house can see it) as we have done in recent years. These cards have been distributed as part of "Rapid Assessment Packets" in recent years. Block captains will contact each family or household and will report information (by 2:00 PM) to the emergency preparedness coordinator for the area. Area coordinators will contact each block captain and will report information (by 3:00 PM) to CERT leadership (at the Perry City offices).*

GARBAGE DAY

The holidays throughout the year that will affect our regular garbage pick-up will be **Labor Day, 4th Of July, Memorial Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas Day, and New Years Day.**



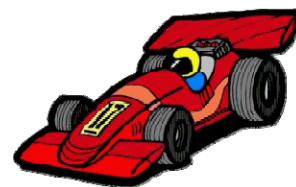
GREEN WASTE

BURN PERMITS

Before you burn your spring trimmings, you must first obtain a burn permit. There is no cost. Permits are issued by Brigham City and can be obtained by going online thru Perry City's web page. Under Frequently requested there is a link for open burning permits. Permits will be available on days with good air quality, and fires must be put out by dark. Open burn goes from March 1st to May 31st.
