

yard. She stated that the Perry City waste has been taken away and so they have to go to Brigham which is \$7 a week to take weeds and green waste there. Board Member Hansen said that the Flood Control Board has encouraged the city to do a yearly maintenance on the ponds. He said this board has taken upon cleaning out some of the basins. Board Member Hansen said that it really is not the Flood Controls responsibility. He suggested that they put a letter together and sign it and turn it into the Mayor and City Council, or get put on the City Council Agenda and go talk with the Mayor and Council about the same things you told us tonight. Mrs. Hendricks asked who was responsible to clean the ponds. Board Member Hansen stated that the Public Works is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the ponds. Board Member Hansen explained that The Flood Board and Perry City hate the ponds but until we can get a major collection basin on the west end of town we have to have all these smaller basins. He explained that every development and every commercial development has to have their own individual one.

Natalie Lund stated that there is a lot of cat feces and garbage in the basin behind their house. She said they have a separate fenced area for their dogs so that their kids can out and play. Vice Chairman Pebley said that the Flood Control cleaned out seven ponds. Board Member Hansen stated that they are trying to get a vegetation planted in there that is slow growing and requires very little mowing. He said we are doing a test pond over by the Rusted Spoon and if it works out then all the basins will be planted in this grass. Board Member Hansen stated that the board members will look at where the signs are at and see if we can move them. Kolt Lund said that the reason he threw the grass over into the pond was to keep the weeds down. He said he does round up along the side of the pond not in the pond he does not want to contaminate the water system. Board Member Hansen stated that each pond has a designated easement to access it.

Mrs. Lund commented that it is not fair to them to have weeds growing over their fence. Board Member Hansen said that we are trying to stop dumping and will move the signs. Mr. Lund stated that he was going to contact the private land owner about her weeds. Board Member Hansen said you have more luck going through the city with the private land owner. Mrs. Lund said she did get a second garbage can for clippings.

Board Member Hansen suggested that they not dump their clippings over into the basin. He said that the city has an operation and maintenance plan just for the

basins and needs to implement it. Vice Chairman Pebley stated that if there were four neighbors around the pond and all four neighbors took care of the pond we would have a clean city.

Mrs. Lund felt like the sign was in their face. She felt the city should have called or come to her house and let her know that the basin is a problem and find the least restrictive way to handle the problem. Board Member Hansen said letters have been sent out to residents in town about dumping and cleaning their vacant lots and nothing has been done.

Mrs. Lund said that the placement of the signs was a big deal and offensive to them. Board Member Hansen stated that they will go look at the signs and figure out a way to move them so that it is not offensive to them. Mrs. Lund said that the placement is a huge thing I think it was offensive and placement should be considered.

Jen Perry asked if there was a time frame when this would be done and when they should hear something. Board Member Hansen said it should be done in a week weather permitting. Board Member Hansen said this should bring awareness to the city to do maintenance on the ponds.

Board Member Hansen said that they need to be moved 20 feet back so when they go to dump grass in the pond they will see the sign.

4. Update report from Bio West regarding the basins

Board Member Hansen talked with Chris Sands with Bio West and they got their review comments back from the State and they have put all those changes into their report. Chris Sands is going through the report and doing the quality control. Board Member Hansen reported that the report will go back to the DWR and the State the end of this week or next week for approval. He stated we are on the last round of changes.

5. Update/Action on the grass planted at the basin south of the Rusted Spoon.

The grass has been planted and it is starting to sprout.

6. Discussion/Action on cleaning out the basin behind 165 East 1550 South.

Board Member Hansen said that Bryce Thurgood got a bid from Jim Keller for \$2,800 and he is supposed to get one more bid. This will be discussed net month.

7. Discussion on 2020 Budget items

Board Members were in agreement to leave the budget the same as what was in the packet. Board Member Hansen said that if there are monies that needs to be added then there will be a budget update.

8. Motion to approve invoice payments

Vice Chairman Pebley stated that there were four invoices to pay. They are as follows:
