FINANCIAL AUDIT FISCAL YEAR 2020

During the January 14, 2021 City Council Meeting the Perry City Fiscal Year 2020 Financial Statement and Audit Report was presented to the City Council. The report reflected that Perry City's finances are in good order. The City's net position increased by \$846,996 or 4.4% from the prior year; fund balances in the governmental funds increased by \$91,046 or 3.3%; fund balances in the utility fund increased \$213,544; fund balances in the Sewer Fund increased \$61,644; and the City's long term debt decreased by 9.5%.

The audit report concluded that the year ended in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, there were no deficiencies in internal controls, and the City complied, in all material respects, with general compliance requirements identified by the state.

The auditor did identify one instance of non-compliance, which involved an electronic report submitted to the Money Management Council that listed book balances instead of bank balances. The City will review the data more carefully before submitting this report going forward.

MESSAGE FROM THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT

The Perry City Public Works Department is requesting home and business owners to work with us in making the streets and sidewalks safe for travel during and shortly after snowstorms. The main roads receive priority with any snowstorm. After the main roads are cleared, we are then able to move to residential streets. When residential streets are cleared, the plows will then work on cul-de-sacs and dead-end streets. Our crews work long hours so you can travel safely!

The Following Actions are Not Allowed:

- Blowing or pushing snow into or across any city street. Try putting it on your front yard, the grass will enjoy the extra water this spring.
- Parking vehicles (i.e. trailers, campers, boats) on city streets during a snowstorm. This also includes cul-de-sacs and dead-end streets.

Homeowner's Responsibilities:

- Removing the snow in front of your mailbox once plows have been through the neighborhood.
- Don't leave garbage cans next to the curb after the pickup.
- Clearing snow from sidewalks in front of their homes.
- Removing the snow from around a fire hydrant. If there is a fire hydrant in front of a resident's home, please clear it of all snow.
- Clearing snow from driveway approaches. Snow accumulated on the plow blade has no place to go but in the roadway, which unfortunately includes driveway approaches.
