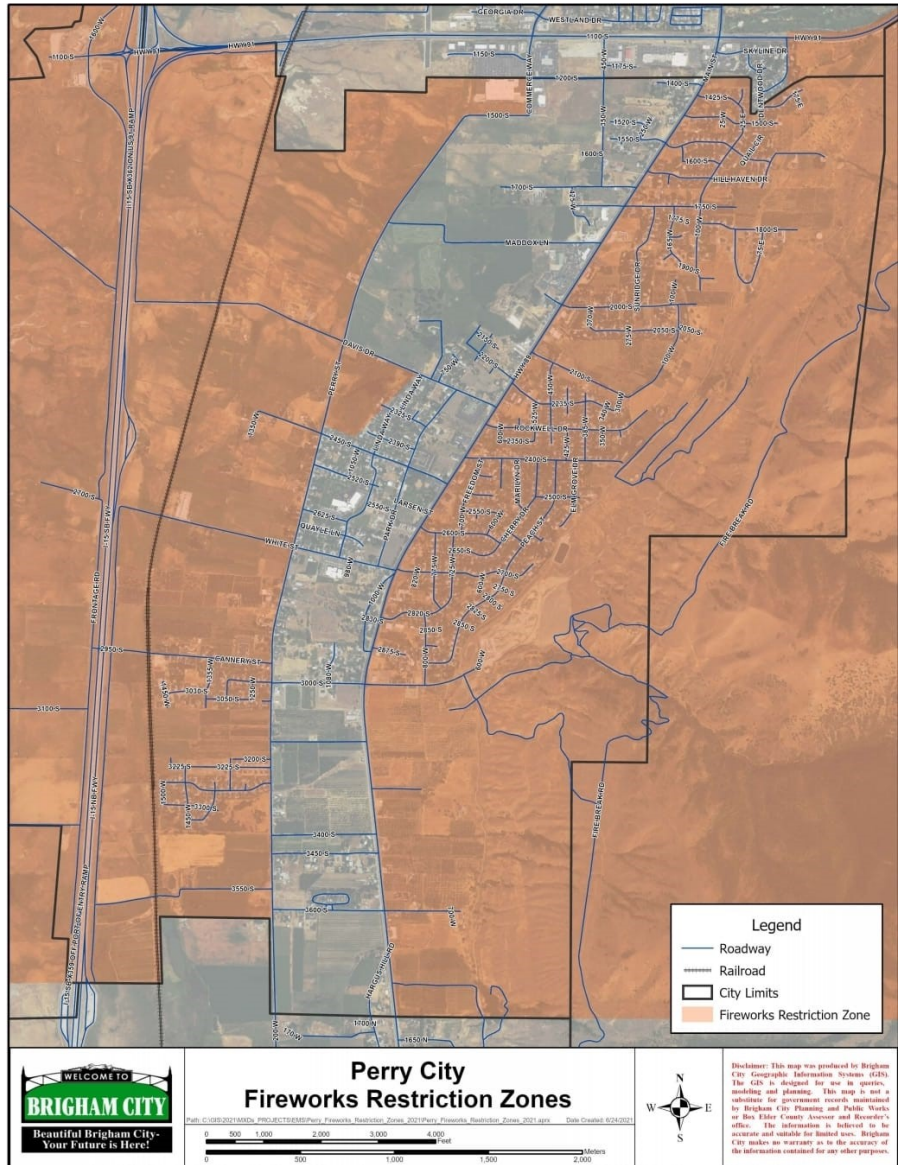

UPDATED FIREWORK RESTRICTIONS

The Fire Marshall has made changes to Perry's firework restrictions. Fireworks are now banned anywhere EAST of Hwy 89 and WEST of 1200 West. PLEASE FOLLOW THESE RESTRICTIONS to keep our community as safe as possible in the dry weather we are having, as well as to avoid any possible citations and fines. We appreciate your cooperation in this matter! The City will be doing our Firework show Friday July 2nd after the softball games at dusk at Perry Park.

REMINDER ON CULINARY WATER RATE INCREASE

The \$4.50 increase on the monthly water rate was approved by City Council at the June 10th meeting. You will notice this increase on your next bill that you will receive August 1.



LETTER FROM PUBLIC WORKS

Perry City warns against flushing these items down the toilet.

Flushing disinfection or baby wipes— *even those that are labeled flushable or biodegradable*— and paper towels down the toilet can lead to sewer backups and in home plumbing issues.

Many sewer blockages occur between the house or business and Perry City's sewer main where the property owner is responsible for correcting the problem. If a main sewer becomes plugged with flushable wipes, the homeowner or business owner that flushed them down would be responsible for any damage that was caused as well as the cost of cleaning the sewer main.

We want to help our customers avoid blockages and a plumbing emergency. Flushing the wrong things down the drain could cause problems to the sewer system. While it may seem to make your daily life easier, putting the wrong thing down the toilet or drain can and does cause blockages, which take time and money to fix.
