paper (staples okay), newspaper, envelopes, junk mail, phone books, brochures, magazines



##### PLASTIC

water bottles, take-out containers, soda bottles



##### CARDBOARD

ream wrappers, file folders, poster board, frozen food boxes, cardboard boxes, milk cartons



##### METAL

aluminum beverage cans, food cans, scrap metal, some small appliances



#### do not recycle

- any type of plastic bags
- glass
- aerosol cans
- aluminum foil
- batteries
- mirrors or ceramics
- food waste
- stickers & address labels
- styrofoam
- tissue, paper towels & napkins

#### non-recyclable items that require special handling:

- incandescent light bulbs
- fluorescent tubes
- computers & electronics
- needles or syringes

Permits are issued by Brigham City and can be obtained by going online thru Perry City's web page under frequently requested there is a link for open burning permits. Permits will be available on days with good air quality, and fires must be put out by dark. Open burn goes from March 1st to May 31st.

### DOG LICENSES & BUSINESS LICENSES

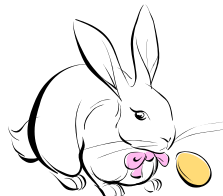
Dog and Businesses Licenses are now due. After March 31st, if they have not been renewed, there will be a late fee applied.
