Pineview Water will be turned off by October 15th this year.




THREE MILE CREEK GUN RANGE

ANNUAL FALL CULINARY WATER SYSTEM FLUSHING

Perry City Public Works will start its annual Fall Culinary Water System Flushing beginning September 28, 2020 and will continue through Mid-October. Flushing the water system will improve water quality and service to our customers. Water Utilities may flush the distribution mains for a variety of reasons such as, corrosion control, sediment removal, taste and odor control, control of color, removal of high turbidity, to improve chlorine residuals, and to control bacteriological growths. Benefits of flushing include improved water quality, and to control bacteria growth. It is anticipated some customers may experience temporary discoloring of the culinary water during this process, If this occurs please allow the outside water to flow 5-20 minutes or until the water clears. This process should also be followed on the inside cold water taps, preferably the tub or another unscreened cold water tap to clear the internal plumbing. TREES AND SHRUBS

While doing your fall clean up, please be mindful of your trees or shrubs that may need to be trimmed back if they are growing out into or over the sidewalk and blocking the right of way. This also applies if you have weeds overgrowing the sidewalks and obstructing the path or making it difficult to walk freely on the sidewalks. It is the homeowners responsibility to keep the sidewalks free from obstructions as referenced in Perry City Municipal Code 10.17.020. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
