MESSAGE FROM ECONOWASTE

We are seeing a lot of containers that are overloaded and a lot of extra trash and boxes piled on or around the containers. If the lid on a container is open, it is considered overloaded. Dumping overloaded containers causes messes that our drivers do not have time to clean up, especially in a time as this with COVID-19. It is also difficult to grab a container that is surrounded by excess waste and boxes without making a mess. We would like to help keep your city as clean and sanitary as possible, so if your waste does not fit in your container, we politely ask that you contact the City to order another one.

Some other problems we encounter that may prevent us from servicing your container (s):

- Containers must be placed at least 6 feet away from other cans, light posts, mailboxes, fences, etc.
- Containers should have 14 feet of overhead clearance.
- Please do not block containers with vehicles. It is best to place containers at least 20 feet away from any vehicle.
- Boxes MUST be broken down and must fit in container.
- Non-Collectible items: Motor oil, household chemicals, construction debris (i.e. dirt, rocks, sod, concrete, etc.), fencing, tires, batteries, propane bottles, tanks or barrels of any kind, gasoline or other petroleum products, furniture, or large appliances.
- Non-recyclable items inside the recycling can.

FREE evaluations being offered! The Up To 3 Early Intervention program is a home-based service program which provides services to promote the development of children under the age of 3 with developmental delays or disabilities of various kinds. These services include Behavior services, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Nutrition, Speech and Language, Physical Therapy, Occupation Therapy, and Vision and Hearing Services. BURN PERMITS

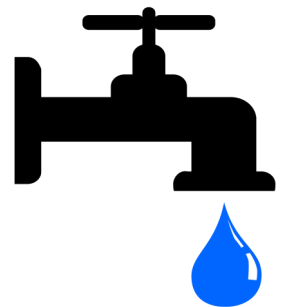
