

# Quilt Doodles Class

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## Class Description

Create your own quilting doodles reference notebook. This class will demonstrate variety of quilting background fillers. Expanding your quilting to the next level in your own quilting journey.

## Project

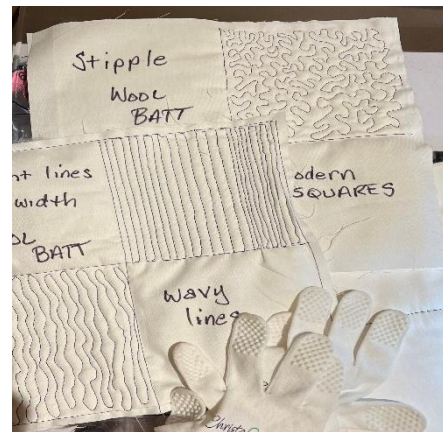
Students will use the quilt sandwiches to quilt a variety of quilting patterns that can be used in lots of quilts and quilting needs for your quilts. Students will also create a sketch book of quilting patterns that can be used as a reference for quilting.

## Duration

Full day workshop

## Skills learned in class

- Quilting techniques
- Stipples
- Modern squares

## Supply list

- 2 yards of solid fabric of your choice cut into 24 – 9 ½ x 9 ½ squares
- 2 yards of batting scraps cut 9 ½ x 9 ½ If you have access to wool or cotton batt then make up the sandwiches with both. It is helpful to see how they both quilt up. (or any other batt that you use.)
- Marker for writing on fabric
- Thread that contrasts to the solid fabric of choice. We want to see the quilt stitches.
- Quilting gloves.
- Optional wrists braces.
- Sketch book for quilting patterns We will be using this in class as part of learning the stitches and for you to take notes on how they are created.
- Pencils for drawing in the class.
- Fabric scissors
- Sewing machine
- Embroidery foot required

## Homework to prepare before class

Cut the solid fabric to create 24- 9 ½ x 9 ½

Cut the batting to create 12 – 9 ½ x 9 ½

Place one piece of batting between two solid squares. This will create the quilt sandwiches used in the class.
