Welcome to The Village Quilt Shoppe; our classes are designed to ensure a fun, relaxing, and educational atmosphere. Come prepared to learn, sew and have fun!

Class: Freezer Paper Foundation Piecing

Date/Time: April 25th

Instructor: Jane Beamish

Supply List (supplies bought at the shop will be 10% off):

1. Fabric* cut to size.
2. Freezer paper template will be provided by the instructor during the class
3. Add-a-Quarter ruler* or Add-a-Quarter Plus ruler. If you happen to have both 6" and 12", bring them both. We can work with either one, so bring what you have.
4. A postcard. If you don't have one, the instructor will provide one to you.
5. Thread (suggested light grey or beige- whatever works with your fabric)
6. Sewing machine with open-toe foot and size 90/14 needle
7. Pre-wound bobbin
8. Scissors for trimming threads
9. Rotary cutter, rotary cutting ruler and rotary cutting mat
10. If you have them, travel/mini iron and pressing surface. If you happen to have it, the mini Clover irons work really well for this technique. You might also want to bring a mug to plop the mini iron in- safer and easier than using the little stand. Regular travel irons are also great!
11. Seam ripper
12. Pencil (**not** a Frixion pen)

Pre-work to be completed before class:

- Gather supplies
- Cut fabric to size

Spool of Thread

If using this cutting guide, label your pieces with post-its or numbered pins or your favorite marking system.

Piece #	Color	Size in inches
1	Thread* (see note under chart)	1 ¼ x 5** (see note under chart)
2	Thread*	2 ¼ x 5
3	Thread*	2 ¼ x 5
4	Thread*	2 x 5
5	Thread*	1 ¼ x 5
6	Thread*	2 x 5
7, 8	background	Cut two: 1 ½ x 5 ¼
9, 10	spool top and bottom	Cut two: 1 ¾ x 6 ½
11,12	borders (same or different than background)	Cut two: 1 ½ x 7 ¼
13, 14	Borders (same or different than background)	Cut two: 1 ½ x 8 ¼
		Bring extra of all fabrics in case of an "oops!"
NOTE: This block finishes at 7 ½ x 8	If you would like to make it bigger, cut larger borders.	For larger borders, cut two: 2 x 7 ¼ and cut two: 2 x 10

***A stripe is HIGHLY recommended in order to create the illusion of thread wrapped around a spool. Cut thread pieces so that the length of the piece (5") is parallel to the lines of the stripe.**



**** The sizes as written are large enough for the pattern. If you prefer not to deal with quarter inches, feel free to cut larger. Piece #1 could measure 1 ½" x 5" or even 2" x 5".**

Additional comments:

- This is a participation class.
- Each class member will need their own supplies and tools.
- Class will start at the designated time.
- You are welcome to come to the shoppe before class to purchase items, cut fabric, set up your machine, etc.
- In order to finish the project at home, you will need backing fabric, batting, and binding.
