

Beginning Quilting 101

Learn every step of the quilt-making process in this class designed for beginning sewists. The classes will begin with fabric selection. Then will cover general overview of quilting with hands-on demos of the basic tools and techniques including cutting, piecing, pressing, borders, basting, quilting, trimming, and binding. After taking this class you'll be ready to make any number of quilt projects. There's nothing like a handmade quilt - now you can make your own!

Supply List

You will **NOT** need to bring any supplies or sewing machines to the first class. We will select fabrics and go over the supplies if you have any questions.

- An assortment of fat quarters and small amount of yardage will be selected and purchased at the first class
- Pattern - will be provided during first class
- Sewing machine in good working order and instruction manual is recommended especially if you are a newer sewer.
- 1/4" foot for your brand machine model
- Walking foot for your brand machine (highly recommended)

Please bring to all other classes...

- Rotary cutter (Olfa recommended)
- Self healing cutting mat 18" x 24" or larger (24" x 36" is ideal)
- Acrylic cutting ruler: 6" x 24" (highly recommend Creative Grids brand)
- Scissors / snips
- Thread for piecing (neutral)
- Straight pins
- Seam ripper

Supplies to bring to later classes

- Thread for quilting (coordinating color)
- Curved basting safety pins
- Batting (We will discuss the differences in types of batting, etc. during the earlier sessions)
- Thread to match your binding fabric
- Hand-sewing needle
