



Beginner Foundation Paper Piecing – Class Supply List

Welcome! I'm so excited to have you join this fun and creative introduction to Foundation Paper Piecing (FPP). This technique opens up a world of precise and intricate designs, even for beginners! Below is a list of tools and fabric you'll need to bring with you to class.



Tools & Notions

- **Sewing Machine**
(If you have an open-toe foot, that would work the best)
- **Rotary Cutter***
- **Cutting Mat*** *(if you have a mat around 6x8 or a small rotating mat)*
- **Add-a-Quarter Plus Ruler***
- **Fabric Water-Soluble Glue Pen***
- **Flat head pins***
- **Quilting ruler** (around 8 or longer)
- **Seam Roller ***



Fabric Requirements

- **(2) Contrasting Fabrics** – $\frac{1}{3}$ yard each
(For example: black and white)
 - Cut **(16)** rectangles from each fabric: **3½" x 6"**
- **(4) Coordinating Fat Quarters**, grouped in pairs:
 - **Group 1** – e.g., *Teal and Light Purple* (seen in the sample mini quilt)
 - Cut **(10)** squares from each: **5" x 5"**
 - **Group 2** – e.g., *Magenta and Pink*
 - Cut **(7)** squares from each: **5" x 5"**
 -

◆ **Please bring any leftover fabric from these cuts with you to class**—we may be able to use extra pieces during the lesson or for troubleshooting.

◆ Final Notes

That's everything you'll need to get started! Please have your fabric pre-cut before class so we can dive right into the piecing process. If you're unsure about anything on the list, feel free to bring a few extra options.

We'll go over the basics, answer questions, and you'll leave with the skills (and confidence!) to continue paper piecing on your own. Can't wait to stitch with you!
