

Prairie Patchwork Quilt Along





Cutting Instructions:

From cream #1, cut:

- **♥** 3 squares, 4¾" x 4¾"
- ♥ 9 squares, 2" x 2"

From red #2, cut:


♥ 3 squares, 4¾" x 4¾"

Instructions:

1. Follow Step 1 on page 28 of <u>Prairie Patchwork</u>, under "Making the Sashing Units and Outer Borders" for St. Clair Sawmill, substituting the cream #1 squares for the cream squares, and the red #2 squares for the brown B squares. Make a total of 24 half-square-triangle units measuring 2" x 2", including seam allowances. You will use 18 units. 2. Sew two half-square triangle units and one 2" cream #1 square to make a row as shown. Press the seams open. Repeat to make a total of six rows.



3. Sew a half-square-triangle unit on opposite sides of one 2" cream square. Press the seams open. Repeat to make a total of three rows.



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4. Attach a Step 2 row to opposite sides of a Step 3 row to complete one block, measuring 5" square, including seam allowances. Press the seams open. Repeat to make a total of three "L" blocks.
