


## Cutting Instructions:

From cream \#3, cut:

- 1 square, $43 / 4$ " $\times 43 / 4$ "

ヤ 4 squares, $2^{\prime \prime} \times 2^{\prime \prime}$
From red \#2, cut:

- 1 square, $43 / 4 " \times 43 / 4 "$
- 1 square, $2^{\prime \prime} \times 2$ "


## Instructions:

1. Follow Step 1 on page 28 of Prairie Patchwork, under "Making the Sashing Units and Outer Borders" for "St. Clair Sawmill", substituting the $43 / 4$ " cream \#3 square for the cream square, and the $43 / 4$ "red \#2 square for the brown $B$ square. Make a total of 8 half-square-triangle units measuring 2" x 2", including seam allowances. You will use 4 units.
2. Sew a half-square-triangle unit to opposite sides of a cream square. Press the seams towards the square. Repeat to make a second row.

3. Sew a cream square to opposite sides of the red \#2 square. Press the seams towards the red square.

4. Sew a Step 2 row to opposite sides of the Step 3 row to make the "R" block. Press the seams open. The block should measure $5^{\prime \prime}$ square, including seam allowances.

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
