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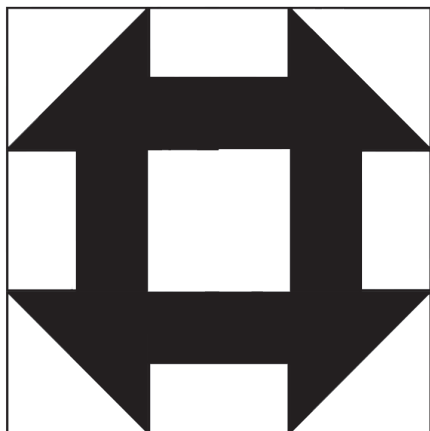

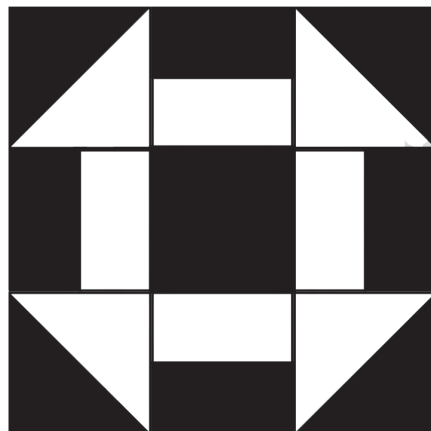
Block 12

FREE PATTERN

- Make the same block twice
- Blocks are mirror images
- Unfinished block size is $9\frac{1}{2}$ "



Block 12a.



Block 12b.

2 contrasting fabrics— $\frac{1}{8}$ yard each

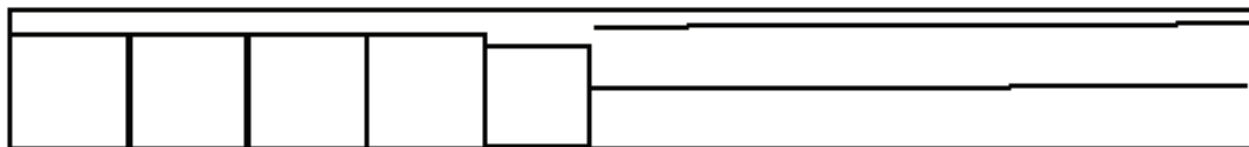
Label your fabrics #1 and #2 (It doesn't matter which way you label them)

From each of the fabrics cut:

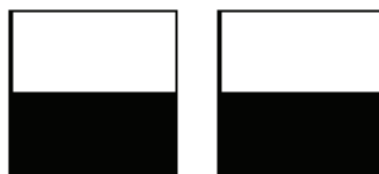
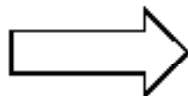
Cut (4) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " squares

Cut (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square

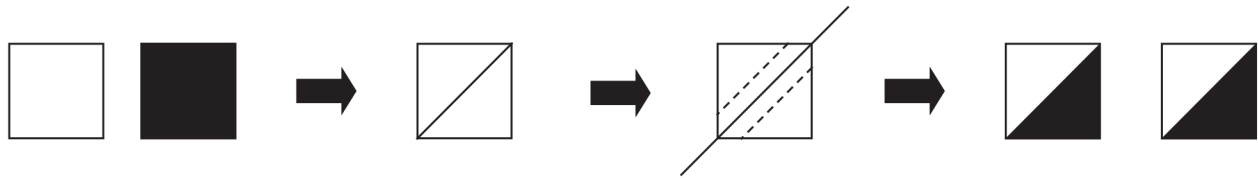
Cut remaining fabric into (2) 2" strips (see cutting diagram below)



Block 12a. Take one of the 2" strips from fabric #1 and one of the 2" strips from fabric #2. Sew strips together and sub cut into $3\frac{1}{2}$ " sections yielding four squares. (See below).



Take (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " square from fabric #1 and (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " square from fabric #2. Place one square of each fabric right sides together and draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one of the squares. Pin. Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from both sides of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line and you have two sewn half square triangle units! Repeat this process to yield a total of four sewn half square triangle units. See diagram below.



Place units as shown in Block 12a. diagram above with (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square from fabric #1 in the center. Sew units together.

Block 12b. Take one of the 2" strips from fabric #2 and one of the 2" strips from fabric #1. Sew strips together and sub cut into $3\frac{1}{2}$ " sections yielding four squares. (See diagram above).

Take (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " square from fabric #2 and (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " square from fabric #1. Place one square of each fabric right sides together and draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one of the squares. Pin. Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from both sides of the drawn line. Cut apart on the drawn line and you have two sewn half square triangle units! Repeat this process to yield a total of four sewn half square triangle units. See diagram above.

Place units as shown in Block 12b. diagram above with (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square from fabric #2 in the center. Sew units together
