Class Supply List

General

Pins, regular sewing pins and applique pins if you have them
Freezer paper, a small piece approx. 8-1/2 x 11 is fine
Fine point Sharpie or pencil
Paper scissors
Thread snips
Scissors to cut wool
That Purple Thang (what?? – you'll know what that is if you have one)
Small ruler, about 1" x 6"
Any wool thread you may have
Any pearl cotton you may have
Paper & pen in case you want to take notes

Don't buy any supplies yet – bring these to the first class if you have them.

Optional

Creative Stitching book by Sue Spargo
Needle threader
Thimble
Fabric glue
Camera
Bring one show & tell item you may have made that is wool with embroidery.

For this class only, bring (again, only if you have them):

Small cutting mat, rotating if you have one

Rotary blade

Small ruler, like 4" x 6" or 4" x 8" or 4" x 12", etc.

Wool

If you **ordered the kit** for the needle keeper, it will be available in class.

If you prefer to **make your own kit**, these are the supplies you will need -- bring all to class:

Outside cover, wool, 6" x 9-1/2"
Inside cover, wool, 6" x 9-1/2" (you may want the inside and outside covers to match)
Inside needle page, wool, 6" x 9-1/2"
Tulip, wool, 2-1/2" x 3"
Stem & leaves, wool, 3" x 3"
Stripe on tulip, wool, 1" x 3"
Dots, wool, 1" x 2-1/2"
3/8" Grosgrain ribbon, 2/3 yd.
Peltex or heavy interfacing, 6" x 9"
1 tube 6 mm beads, we used 6/0 "E" beads, 9g or .31 Oz.

If you **prefer not to make the needle keeper**, you do need to have wool to practice with in class. Just bring several pieces of scrap wool.

Class participants will receive a 15% discount off class supplies and purchases the day of class.
