**What is stormwater?** Stormwater is excessive rainfall that does not soak into the ground, but instead flows over the land's hard surface into the nearest water body through storm drain channels.

#### What is stormwater pollution?

Stormwater pollution comes directly from runoff during a storm event. This water can runoff of roof tops, driveways, parking lots, yards, and streets. During this event, water picks up many of the pollutants that are already on these surfaces, such as toxic metals, pesticides, fertilizers, vehicle oils, dirt particles, trash and leaves. The water, and all its pollutants, travels to the local storm sewer and into local rivers, streams, and eventually into Utah Lake.

Under federal law, the Salem City is required to control its storm water that enters the local watersheds and reduce the amounts of pollutants that the stormwater contains. District agencies (Salem City, DWQ, EPA) are actively involved in developing practices that reduce pollutants at the source, long before they enter critical water bodies. **Outdoor Watering Conservation Tips**
