




PI WATER

If your house number is an odd number, you will water on odd calendar days. If your house number is an even number, you will water on even calendar days. We recognize that we will have a hiccup with those months that have 31 days (May, July, Aug). We are asking that the 31st of those months be recognized as a NO WATER DAY. The City will send out reminders as those days approach. We will inform our citizens if we find that greater restrictions are necessary. Please do your part to help us conserve! And, as always, **no watering is allowed from 10:00 am-6:00 pm on any day.**

PUBLIC HEARING
Salem City Budget
Transfers and Administrative Fees
Fiscal Year 2019

In accordance with Utah State Law and Salem City budgeting practices, Salem City will hold a **Public Hearing** on June 6, 2018 at 7:00 pm in the Salem City Council Chambers located at 30 West 100 South, Salem Utah, to discuss proposed transfers from Enterprise Funds to the General Fund and General Fund administrative fees (indirect services) charged to the Enterprise Funds. Anyone desiring to address the Salem City Council on this issue is invited to attend the public hearing.

A transfer is the movement of cash or other resources from one fund to another. Salem City has utilized transfers from Enterprise Funds as a General Fund financing mechanism for many years. If budgeted and planned for correctly, transfers from Enterprise Funds can help to defray the cost of services such as public safety, public works, parks/recreation and general governmental services, and consequently, keep property taxes low. Without the transfers, Salem City would either have to significantly raise property taxes or significantly cut services.

If utility services were provided by private utility companies, the return on investment would be paid to investor-owners; because Salem taxpayers are the investor-owners of utilities, the residents receive this return on investment as a transfer to the General Fund.

Following are the proposed Fiscal Year 2019 transfers from the Enterprise Funds:




Indirect service charges are not the same as transfers. While transfers are a movement of cash or resources without compensation, indirect services are charges for centralized services provided by the general fund to the other funds of the City. Such services include but are not limited to utility billing, accounting, payroll, legal services, human resources, facility management, engineering, etc. These administrative fees are allocated by the finance department in a reasonable and rational manner.
