Our library has been underfunded for years, and successful events such as these make the dream of one day building a larger library possible.



The city has been very busy this month. We had a ground breaking on our new water treatment facility. It was well supported by both local and state officials as well as residents and contractors. We are looking forward to having a facility that can support Salem for future generations as we continue to grow.

Salem Emergency Management Association purchased a much-needed defibrillator. A defibrillator is a vital link between EMT's in the field and emergency room physicians. The previous defibrillator was purchased back in 1996 and was lacking some life-saving functions. The new one will allow the ER physician to see vital patient information and make life saving decisions. The new defibrillator will be placed in our primary ambulance and the older one will be placed in our back-up ambulance.

The city is continuing to improve our roads. One of our next projects is improving center street's sidewalks and roads. If you have a road concern please bring it to the city so we can investigate the area.

With Labor Day around the corner please remember that the city office will be closed on Monday, September 3rd and garbage pick up will be delayed one day.

STORMWATER: As stormwater flows over driveways, lawns and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt and other pollutants. Stormwater can flow into a storm sewer system or directly to a lake, stream, river or wetland. Anything that enters a storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the water bodies we use for swimming, fishing and providing drinking water. Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water. By practicing healthy household habits, homeowners can keep common pollutants like pesticides, pet waste, grass clippings, and automotive fluids off the ground and out of stormwater.

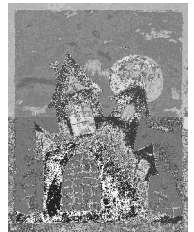
