The Sewing Circle

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Project #1: Place-mats from "Stack, Slash & Sash"

Learn a "new" way to make fun placemats

Class Fee: \$35 (includes the book)

Use a Jelly roll or cuts from your favorite collections!

Supplies:

- Book (included in price of class)
- Scraps (minimum 2"x6") or jelly rolls to use in "stripping"
- 1 yard fabric for top, 1 yard fabric for bottom (this will make 4 generous sized placemats)
- 1 package "Soft & Stable" (36"x 58")
- Thread to match (50 weight cotton for piecing preferred), Any type for quilting
- Walking foot (dual feed)
- Rotary cutter, Mat & ruler (12" long minimum)
- Wonder clips (optional but recommended) or pins
- Steam-a-seam 2, 1/4" wide roll (optional but recommended)
- Left edge top-stitch foot (optional but recommended)
- Microtex 80 needle, Universal 75 needle
- Thread snips
- Sewing machine in good working order

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Project #2: Tuffets...you will want one! Jelly roll, Fabric to match a room, Embroideries, whatever you want....Super Fun!

We will have ALL the supplies to make one for every "Miss Muffet" you know!









Supplies:

- Kit \$140 (you can use your 15% discount) includes:
 - o Pattern with instructions
 - o fusible pattern material (I will have extra kits of just the pattern fusible for sale if you want to make more of these YOU WILL!)
 - o 1 yard muslin
 - o Round 18" base (wood) with all holes drilled for feet (metal feet attachments have been installed) and button, rounded and sanded
 - o Round 18" Foam 6" high
 - Upholstery batting
 - o cording for button attachment and bottom securing
 - o 12" long upholstery needle (we will share one unless you want to buy one of your own)
 - Button to cover
 - Staple gun (we will share one)
 - o 3 "BUN" feet (pictured as blue round feet in bottom right picture), sanded ready for any type of finishing you want to do. If you want 4 feet, cost is \$5 per foot.
 - Spray adhesive (we will share)
- Microtex needle (size 90)
- Universal needle (size 80)
- Thread to match (all purpose Mettler, Gutterman, Sulky....no coats & clark)
- Jelly roll or 1/2 yard of minimum 8 fabrics (I used 16 different fabrics 1/2 yard cuts and made my own 2.5" strips this made enough for 2 tuffets!)
- Add-a-guarter 12" ruler (NECESSARY!)
- Rotary cutter& Small cutting mat to have at your sewing station
- Small Iron & Small pressing mat to have at your sewing station
- Best Press or spray alternative (optional but recommended)
- Thread snips
- Sewline Glue stick with refills (optional but recommended) or MANY pins
- Sewing machine in good working order



Put it together in one of many different types of "Slab" Quilts. One of the newest "Modern" uses for scraps!

Project #3: Slab Quilting

Always wonder what to do with all those scraps? This is the most creative use! Make your slabs as you have scraps, make them when you have collected all your scraps, or- make slabs and trade with friends!







Supplies:

We will be working on the TOP only. SUPER fun way to use up LOTS of scraps.

- Large ziploc Bags (or small bins) of scraps, color sorted. One bag(box) for each color. You can use Fat 1/8's or Fat 1/4's if you do not have scraps. Recommended about 6-8 different fabrics in each color family. Be open to sharing with others this will open the "creative" look of each block. This is a GREAT "random"
- If you wish to "border" your blocks as in top left picture, 1 yard of fabric to "frame" (this is the white in the picture), 1/4 1 yard of each color you want to make the larger frame (these are the colored frames outside the white frame on each block). If you want just one border around the blocks (as in the copy in the bottom right
- Universal needle (size 80)
- Thread to match (all purpose Mettler, Gutterman, Sulky....no coats & clark)
- Add-a-quarter 6 or 12" ruler (NECESSARY!)
- Rotary cutter& Small cutting mat to have at your sewing station
- Small Iron & Small pressing mat to have at your sewing station
- Best Press or spray alternative (optional but recommended)
- Thread snips
- Sewline Glue stick with refills (optional but recommended) or MANY pins
- Sewing machine in good working order
