Insert for the Front Cover of a Binder



Happy New Year! It is only fitting that the first project of the New Year will be to create your own insert for the front cover of a binder. Then you can use your customized binder to store all of your Intro to Mastering Your Machine Club handouts and sample stitch outs in the coming months. The contents of the binder will document your journey as you explore and use the features within your amazing, delightfully intuitive, and uniquely capable sewing and embroidery machine. In this class we will learn how to download two of the free Embroidery designs from the Creativate Library, create folders within your machine to store the designs you create in our Club and create a lovely design for the front cover of the binder. The built in Embroidery Fonts will also be used. We will then stitch out the embroidery design you have created. The insert for the cover for the sample was stitched out on white felt and will slip inside the clear cover on a binder.

### Supply List

HV Designer Sewing and Embroidery Machine, Embroidery Arm, Foot Control Pedal, Power Cord, Sensor Q Foot, Single Hole Stitch Plate

Rubber-tipped stylus to use on the capacitive touch screen on your machine

Embroidery Hoop: Designer Crown Hoop (260 mm x 200 mm)

*HV* Topstitch 80 needle (**Available for purchase at Patty's**)

No Show Mesh Stabilizer – will need one piece to fit the 260 mm x 200 mm hoop (**Available for purchase at Patty’s**)

Heat Soluble Topping/Stabilizer such as *Inspira* Heat and Melt (**Available for purchase at Patty’s**)

White felt – cut 14” x 12” (this will be sufficient size for both the front cover (which we will create in Feb and the binder spine). Recommend buying felt in the fabric section and not the individual small sheets of felt sold in the crafting section of your local craft store.)

Fusible Woven Interfacing (such as Pellon SF 101): 2 pieces measuring 14” x 12” (**Available for purchase at Patty’s**). One piece will be fused to the back of the felt before embroidering the design and the other piece will be fused on afterwards to provide additional stability.

40 wt. Rayon or Polyester Embroidery Threads: See RA Rayon thread colors used in the original designs below. You may use any good quality 40 wt. Rayon or Polyester Embroidery thread. Feel free to substitute colors that work for you. Note on my sample, I elected not to stitch the word “Viking” out in the eggshell color but used a red color to stand out against my white felt. I also used RA 2296, Black instead of RA 2565, Aged Charcoal and I substituted another gold color for the Star Gold. Choose your favorite color for lettering. (**See threads available for purchase at Patty’s**)



RA 2420, Tuxedo Red; RA 2408, Star Gold; RA 2729, Mineral; RA 2541, Black Chrome; RA 2343, Eggshell



RA 2565, Aged Charcoal; RA 2271, Heather; RA 2618, Pro Night Sky; RA 2733, Pro Cool Gray; RA 2729, Mineral

Embroidery Bobbin Thread – I used Black Embroidery Bobbin Thread since a lot of the colors used were dark but you could opt to use white embroidery bobbin thread (**Available for purchase at Patty's**)

mySewnet User Name (usually your email address) and your password.

Rotary Cutter **and** a Rotary Cutter with Pinking Blade or Pinking Shear scissors to trim the final stitch out

Small ruler to trim felt after stitch out --- a 4" x 14" ruler works well or similar size

Fabric Pressing cloth to use when fusing SF 101 to the back of the felt before we embroider on it

**General Sewing Supplies and Tools** (such as Pins, Snips, Scissors, Seam Ripper, Rotary Cutter with sharp blade; non-permanent fabric marking pen, Rulers to mark fabric and stabilizer, etc.)

Clear Cover 1½" or 2" Binder – color of your choice. (This Clear Cover binder had a plastic insert on the front and the spine to insert the embroidery stitch out into.)
