



February 2019 Designer EPIC Club

This month we will continue our exploration and review of the features within our Top-of-the-Line Designer EPIC. We will be doing a deep dive into our Fonts Menu and all of the options available when we wish to create our own personalized message. We will complete two exercises and stitch these designs out for a sample in our Designer EPIC Reference book. In the first exercise we will program text on a shape. In the second exercise we will program using text and a design. I stitched both of my designs out on white felt and placed them in a document protector for my reference book but you may opt to stitch them out on the bib of an apron or on a tea towel.

Supply List

Designer EPIC Sewing and Embroidery Machine, Embroidery Arm, Foot Control Pedal, Power Cord, Sensor Q Foot, Single Hole Stitch Plate

Crown Hoop (260 x 200) Hoop and one of the designs will fit in the 200 x 200 hoop

Inspira Topstitch 80 needle

Inspira Tear Away Stabilizer to fit the hoop x two (2 hoopings) you could also use *Inspira* Cut Away Stabilizer

Heat Soluble Topping/Stabilizer such as *Inspira* Heat and Melt or *Jenny Haskins* Heat Magic

White felt – two pieces 8” x 14”

Fusible Woven Interfacing: 2 pieces measuring 8” x 142”

2 Spool 40 wt. Rayon Embroidery Thread in your favorite color for one stitch out.

For the second stitch out (Hotdog): RA 2343, Eggshell; RA 2289, Rust; RA 2605, Goldenlite; RA 2472, Auburn; RA 2296, Black

Embroidery Bobbin Thread

Straight pins

Rotary Cutter with Pinking Blade

Small ruler to trim felt after stitch out --- a 4” x 14” ruler works well or similar size

General Sewing Supplies and Tools (such as Pins, Snips, Scissors, Seam Ripper, Rotary Cutter with sharp blade; fabric marking pen, Rulers to mark fabric and stabilizer, etc.)

2 Document Protectors if you want to stitch out the designs for your reference book or whatever object you wish to stitch the designs on. You might decide you would like to stitch out the design on a tote bag or the hotdog one on the bib of an apron. The choice is yours!
